CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, one of the things that we're going to start off with, a notice is hereby given to the starting of -- starting at 1 p.m., this Thursday, February 22, 2018, Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training will hold a public comment hearing and regularly scheduled meeting at the Casa Blanca Hotel, in Mesquite, Nevada.

I want to mention also, if we could, to give thanks to all the people that are here, to remind that the public must sign over here on my right, if you could put your name down and whatever agency you might be with, we'd appreciate that. Also, if anybody in here would like to say anything, this is at the table in front of us, and share what your name is and what agency you're from, if that does apply.

I want to ask everyone here that hopefully you turn off your cell phones. I would appreciate that so it doesn't go off in front of all this. Commissioners, make sure that all your names are aloud. Every time you say -- you want to say something, be sure to say what your name is so we have that for the record. And don't also forget the mikes that we have right next to us can be picked up

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1 anywhere to Scott, to my right over here, so he has to
2 deal with that. So let's make sure that we're not
3 talking to somebody else while we're in the process of
4 doing this.

5 Okay. So what we want to do right now is
6 we're going to start off with the call to order, which
7 we have done. But we also want to mention the call of
8 the Commission members, itself. And to my left, if we
9 could start off with that?

10 COMMISSIONER KETSAA: James Ketsaa.

11 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: Kevin McKinney.

12 COMMISSIONER McGRATH: John McGrath.

13 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner.

14 COMMISSIONER REED: Ben Reed.

15 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: James Wright.

16 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Ron Pierini.

17 MR. JENSEN: Mike Jensen.

18 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock.

19 MR. JOHNSTON: Scott Johnston.

20 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you. I want
21 to say John McGrath, this is your first day. I'm glad
22 you're here.

23 COMMISSIONER McGRATH: Thank you.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: And you're with Metro.

25 And Gary, unfortunately, he decided to retire, but

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1 he's here and we like to have you here, and that's
2 really great. So, John, you're taking his spot and I
3 thank you very much for doing that.

4 Okay. What we're going to do right now is
5 we're going to go on further with the public comment
6 hearing and proposed regulations under LCB File
7 R128-17. The purpose of the hearing is to receive
8 comments from all interested persons regarding the
9 adoption, amendment and repeal of the regulations that
10 pertain to Chapter 289 of the Nevada Administrative
11 Code.

12 So we'd like to start off if we could then
13 with the topic, and that's under A, under LCB File
14 R128-17. And, Mike, if you could go ahead and start
15 with that?

16 MR. SHERLOCK: We're going to have Scott.

17 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Or Scott, I'm sorry.

18 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
19 record. The Commission may recall, the last
20 legislative session we were tasked with a regulatory
21 process and creating a voluntary program for
22 dispatcher certification and training. This, what
23 we'll be taking public comment on now, is the version
24 of that regulation that went through the regulatory
25 process and has come back from LCB.

Meeting

1 I just wanted to mention that it may be
2 somewhat confusing for the Commission. If you look at
3 Section 4, LCB also returned it with a Section 5 that
4 replaces Section 4. Just to try to explain that,
5 under federal law where you have employment licensing
6 functions, there is a requirement to ensure there is
7 not child support arrearages, that kind of thing. And
8 so this simply reflects that, one, that we are
9 honoring that federal law; and, two, if that federal
10 law changes, the requirement to check on child support
11 is no longer applicable for this particular
12 certificate. And that's all it is.

13 One other change that LCB threw in is the
14 definition of a basic certificate. They wanted to
15 clarify that, and so to ensure that it's clear, the
16 difference between a dispatcher's certificate and a
17 basic certificate for a peace officer. And so that's
18 where you see that one little line added onto that
19 particular portion of this. But, again, this was a
20 result of the legislature last go-around and our
21 requirement to go through the regulatory process. And
22 that's what -- this is the regulation that was
23 developed based on that.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: If I could say, Mike, I
25 think one of the things that we've done here is the

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1 legislature made this happen. Is that correct? It
2 goes to the LCB. They gave you the whole information
3 of what they felt what the cost was, if there was any
4 issues with it, the best of what I can read from that.
5 We also have over to my right there also is that same
6 information, if you wish to look at that.

7 But I'd like to go to the people here in our
8 room. Is there anybody who would like to make any
9 comments or anything about this whatsoever? Any
10 comments? Any problems with it?

11 TIMOTHY SHEA: I have a question.

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Sure.

13 TIMOTHY SHEA: Where would this
14 training be at, if it were to occur? How would it be
15 administered and how would it be done?

16 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Mike?

17 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
18 record. It is completely web based. We are almost
19 done with it. And it will be all on our platform,
20 which is Moodle. But it's almost completed now and no
21 cost. It'll be, yeah, be through our web site.

22 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: You know, and just in our
23 experience with that is that there's a lot of people
24 who came to us and asked for this particular item.

25 And I think it's a good one, I really do. But on the

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1 other hand, it's something they can or they don't have
2 to do it. It's just whatever they want to do to get
3 that certificate as a plus, I think. Is that pretty
4 fair? So I think that's what it's all about.

5 TIMOTHY SHEA: I agree. I
6 encouraged the dispatch center, when I was in the
7 police department, I was asking how are these folks
8 trained, where is this stuff, where are the standards
9 at. Do we just send them to Metro and hopefully we,
10 you know -- so this is -- I think this is wonderful.
11 It's great, for someone like me coming in from out of
12 the area and saying there don't seem to be any
13 standards, just kind of whatever you feel like.

14 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: And I think also if you
15 look at this that normally it takes about at least 120
16 hours, so it's quite a bit of things that goes with
17 that. So there's a lot of education in there.

18 TIMOTHY SHEA: Yeah, at least worth
19 relating.

20 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: So asking again, anybody
21 else in the room here? No. How about any
22 commissioners here, anybody have any questions or
23 comments they would like to make?

24 Okay, seeing none, I guess we'll go on to
25 the next one. What do you think?

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1 Now we're going to go back to Number II,
2 which is the regularly scheduled meeting. And the
3 first call of order, I'm going to go through the same,
4 if I could. Everyone is still in the same position as
5 they were earlier, I don't think we need to say it
6 again. So why don't we start off with number 3 or do
7 you want me to go through that?

8 (Aside.)

9 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: That's a good point. You
10 know that's why you have an attorney next to you and
11 you sit next to him so he can kick me and tell me what
12 I'm supposed to be saying, right? And I appreciate
13 that. I appreciate it very much.

14 We do not have -- Michele Freeman is not
15 here and also Russell Pedersen, he is not here also,
16 but everybody else is here. Thank you.

17 Okay, number 3 is we're going to go to
18 discussion, public comment, and for possible action:
19 This is the minutes of the October 16, 2017, regularly
20 scheduled POST Commission meeting. I would think that
21 most or all, hopefully, that all of our commissioners
22 have read that. And is there anything that you would
23 like to change or if there was any problems with that,
24 or if some things that were wrong? Anybody have
25 anything they saw in there that wasn't correct?

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1 Okay. Did anybody in the audience have time to
2 look at that? I don't think so, but I'm just going to
3 ask.

4 Okay. All right. Looking for an agenda
5 item, possible action, anybody? Motion? Okay.

6 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: James Wright. I'll
7 make a motion to approve the minutes.

8 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner, second.

9 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Any other
10 questions? All in favor?

11 (Ayes.)

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay. Thank you. We're
13 going to go to number 4, and that's yours, Mike.

14 MR. SHERLOCK: Okay, Mike Sherlock, for the
15 record. I think all of our flights aren't till
16 8 o'clock or later tonight so I can get a lot said, I
17 think, really. Sheriff Furlong, are you driving or
18 are you flying?

19 SHERIFF FURLONG: I'm okay.

20 MR. SHERLOCK: First, I would like to
21 welcome Chief McGrath and Chief Reed, both new
22 Commission members, and thank you for coming out
23 and -- being here for us.

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Volunteering?

25 MR. SHERLOCK: And being here for us. We

1 appreciate it.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You bet.

3 MR. SHERLOCK: So at this point I just want
4 to give a quick update on what staff is doing at POST,
5 up in God's country -- I mean Carson City. And I'll
6 do that as quickly as I can.

7 We currently have a basic training academy
8 in session with 32 cadets. Just a quick note on basic
9 training. As many of you know here on the Commission
10 and in the audience, I'm really a firm believer in our
11 ethical duty to measure a cadet's ability to not only
12 make decisions under stress, but to make the right
13 decisions under stress. With that in mind, we have
14 been increasing our discipline in our performance-
15 based training for a while, within our program. We
16 continue to look at other academies and states and how
17 they are operating, and believe currently there is a
18 trend to move back to a more disciplined program.

19 A lot of this is because many of today's
20 recruits have really very little experience making
21 decisions and are really behind in that area when they
22 enter into our academies. Some of you might have read
23 that the U.S. Army recently released a statement that
24 they are moving to a more disciplined basic training
25 program. They're just finding that their recruits are

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1 quickly returning to a less disciplined, less
2 professional state after they leave their current
3 program. So they are adding more physical training,
4 more drill-and-parade, and more discipline. And we
5 would agree with that assessment, looking at our
6 academy and other academies across the country.

7 So we understand that -- you know, we don't
8 want to lose recruits, but we also have that duty to
9 train recruits and we're trying to balance that every
10 day. We really want to produce recruits that are
11 ready for field training and are able to make ethical,
12 moral, and legal decisions under stress. So we
13 continue to work on that.

14 We are seeing more and more interest in our
15 reserve officer training program. Two more agencies
16 have contacted us and stated that they have a desire
17 to deactivate their reserve training academies and
18 move to our reserve program. We continue to modify
19 this program and look to the best outcome we can, both
20 for the recruit and the agencies. It seems to be
21 working fairly well.

22 In the area of advanced training, our core
23 investigator series continues to move forward. We
24 have presented that course up north once so far.
25 We're doing the south next month. We hope to add a

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1 basic sexual assault or robbery class to the series
2 this year. The basic detective class has received
3 really great reviews and it fills up immediately when
4 we put it out.

5 We are in the process of moving our
6 reciprocity program to the state platform. It should
7 be back up and running and available via our web site
8 any day now, I hope. The state recently introduced a
9 new Moodle platform which really caused some issues
10 for us and with accessibility. We're well aware of it
11 and we're trying to get it back up for the agencies.
12 And, again, it should be any day.

13 Again, the dispatcher training program is
14 very close to being put out, anticipating that the
15 regulation would be approved. Again, that's going to
16 go up on Moodle, which is a new platform for the
17 state. And, again, there will be no cost to the
18 agencies for the dispatcher program.

19 One note of concern for us at POST is, based
20 on our funding, we really do rely on the state in
21 terms of our web-based platforms for online content.
22 I really believe that this, along with our records
23 management system, needs to be addressed. And we will
24 be looking at some of the priorities for our staff in
25 terms of how we deal with our electronic issues in the

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1 future.

2 And the standards division, it is compliance
3 season. I believe we are down to maybe six or seven
4 agencies that are still -- still have peace officers
5 out of compliance, and we're working with them now
6 trying to get that done. Letters of noncompliance
7 went out a couple weeks ago for those that were still
8 out of compliance. But, again, we're working on
9 those. The notice of intent to suspend will go out,
10 Scott?

11 MR. JOHNSTON: First of March.

12 MR. SHERLOCK: First of March for those that
13 remain out of compliance.

14 We continue to review our regulations to
15 ensure that they meet the needs of Nevada agencies.
16 And we continually review our records related to
17 certification. Specifically, we are -- we look at who
18 agencies report have been hired but are not certified.
19 We attempt to make notifications prior to the
20 expiration of the 12 months, and those are the notices
21 that some agencies are receiving from us right now.

22 On the administrative side, we were recently
23 asked to testify in front of the legislative Sunset
24 Subcommittee on Boards and Commissions as to the
25 necessity of POST. Obviously, the necessity was never

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1 in question, but it did give us an opportunity to kind
2 of explain our mission and how we're funded. The
3 subcommittee was actually very interested in two
4 things.

5 First, they were concerned that we are by
6 far the least funded POST entity in the West and it's
7 not even close. And they were also concerned about an
8 issue from back in 2008 where we had an EVOC facility
9 approved and funded, and that money was swept back by
10 the state due to the economic downturn. So the
11 chairman had asked me for some comparisons of
12 surrounding states on how they are funded, and
13 information related to the EVOC facility and today's
14 cost for that facility. Some of the senators
15 separately spoke to me in the hallway and also asked
16 for that same EVOC proposal. So at least we have them
17 talking about our funding and we'll see where it goes.

18 Finally, we do have some new litigation.
19 I'm sure those in the south are aware of it. It has
20 been in the media down here. Really, this is not the
21 place or time for discussion of that, but I just
22 wanted to simply advise the Commission the new suit is
23 Robert Eliason (North Las Vegas Constable) vs. POST
24 and Clark County. Essentially, the suit alleges that
25 the statute that requires certification related to

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1 constables is unconstitutional and it violates the
2 ADA. We recently attended an early neutral
3 evaluation. We were unable to settle the suit at that
4 point, so it continues on.

5 Again, this is not the place or time to
6 discuss it, but I want the Commission to be aware and
7 just understand that it is within the capable and
8 expert hands of Mike Jensen, and we are currently in
9 the federal court down here in Las Vegas on that
10 particular issue.

11 And, finally, I also wanted to mention Chief
12 Gary Schofield, now former commissioner, he's here in
13 the audience. I just wanted to thank him for his
14 service and counsel while on the Commission, and you
15 will be missed for sure. And, really, I want to wish
16 you good luck in your new endeavor. Thanks, Gary.

17 With that, I can answer any questions on
18 staff issues or anything the Commission may have. It
19 wasn't that long, was it?

20 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: No, I think it was great.

21 MR. SHERLOCK: Okay, thank you.

22 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: I'll tell you, Mike does
23 a good job. His staff does a good job. We appreciate
24 all the things that they do.

25 All right. One of the things that we're

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1 talking about with the money issues, that's always
2 going to be a problem unless somebody can turn it
3 around the right way. But unfortunately, it doesn't
4 seem like it moves that way. But it also does, is
5 they work it the best they possible can for what we
6 have. So I appreciate that, Mike.

7 MR. SHERLOCK: Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, we're going to go
9 on to number 5, discussion, public comment, and for
10 possible action: The Commission is to discuss and
11 possible action to adopt a new regulation as follows
12 under A. LCB File No. R128-17. Existing regulations
13 establish the minimum standards of training for peace
14 officers in training category I, II, and III and
15 reserve officers. Proposed regulation establishes
16 minimum training and certification standards of a
17 voluntary training program for law enforcement
18 dispatchers.

19 So, Mike, would you want to start that
20 again, or Scott, or somebody?

21 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
22 record. I guess I would just reiterate what I said
23 earlier. Although it is a bit confusing, staff would
24 recommend that the Commission adopt the language as
25 brought forward by LCB.

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1 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Yeah, and I'd like to
2 also mention, if I could, is the fact that we did
3 spend a lot of time with this. This isn't something
4 we just brought up today. This has been going over
5 several months before. We've had different workshops.
6 We've had times to communicate with people that wanted
7 to have that floored with us and that's how it all
8 created the way it is. And then certainly it went to
9 the legislature and it went to that way. So we've
10 done some really good things I think that and we're
11 ready to go forward with that.

12 But we're also asking anybody here has any
13 comment that they'd like to give us, right now would
14 be the time to do that. So I look out in the
15 audience. Is there anybody who would like to say
16 anything on that? Okay, seeing none, to the
17 Commissioners, does anybody have any questions or
18 anything they would like to say? Yes, sir?

19 COMMISSIONER KETSAA: Jim Ketsaa for the
20 record. I just had a question. I think I got it, but
21 is it now dispatchers have to be in compliance with
22 the child support statute?

23 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Mike, go ahead.

24 COMMISSIONER KETSAA: Or did I miss that?

25 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the

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1 record. I would say, yes, that is the interpretation
2 of LCB. We didn't think -- we didn't feel that's much
3 of an issue because one of the other requirements is
4 that they meet the NCIC level in terms of background,
5 so I don't think it's an issue. But that is the
6 interpretation now, yes.

7 COMMISSIONER KETSAA: Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Anybody else
9 there? Okay, then we look for a motion. This was on
10 number 5.

11 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: James Wright will make
12 the motion to accept the proposed regulations.

13 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: All right. Thank you,
14 Jim. Do I have a second? Somebody want to make a
15 second?

16 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner, I'll make
17 a second.

18 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, sir. Anybody
19 have any questions or comments? Okay, all in favor?

20 (Ayes.)

21 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Anybody opposed? All
22 right, thank you.

23 I'm going to number 6 now, discussion,
24 public comment, and possible action: Hearing pursuant
25 to NAC 289.290(1)(g) revoking Jerry Peek, formerly

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1 with the Lyon County Sheriff's Office, certification
2 based on a guilty plea of Category E felony. The
3 Commission will decide whether to revoke Mr. Peek's
4 category I and III basic certificates. Yours, Mike?

5 MR. JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Mike
6 Jensen, for the record. We have two hearings
7 scheduled for today dealing with certification issues.
8 For new members of the Commission, just to give you a
9 little background on the authority that these hearings
10 are taking place under today, it begins with NRS
11 289.510. And the documents related to this hearing
12 are behind tab 6 for your reference as well.

13 In NRS 289.510, it provides that the
14 Commission has the authority to establish minimum
15 standards for the certification and decertification of
16 officers. Pursuant to that authority, the Commission
17 has adopted regulations where they've established
18 those standards for suspension and revocation of
19 certificates or certifications in NAC 289.290. The
20 specific section that we're dealing with today is
21 section 1(g), which mandates that a certificate be
22 revoked if a peace officer is convicted of a felony.

23 If you look behind Exhibit 6, you'll see,
24 starting with Exhibit A, there are a number of
25 exhibits that are being presented today in support of

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1 any action that may be taken by the Commission and to
2 be considered by the Commission with regard to any
3 action. I would begin just by going through those and
4 giving you a brief description of the exhibits.

5 The first exhibit is our notice of intent to
6 revoke. That's a notice that's required not only by
7 Commission statutes and regulations, but also by the
8 open meeting law requires that any individual that
9 you're going to potentially take action against be
10 given notice of that potential.

11 This particular notice of intent informs
12 Mr. Peek that the Commission is intending to take
13 action to revoke his basic certificate, that -- and
14 provides for the law that that action would be taking
15 place. It informs him of the date, time, and place of
16 this hearing today; his right to appear, present
17 evidence, and cross-examine witnesses. It also
18 provides the legal requirement in the Commission's
19 regulations that anyone requesting or wanting to
20 contest a revocation is supposed to give 15 days'
21 notice to the Commission if they intend to appear and
22 contest the action. And, finally, the scope of the
23 hearing today is whether or not the Commission should
24 revoke Mr. Peek's basic certificate based on a felony
25 conviction.

1 Exhibit B is the certificate of service
2 which shows that Mr. Peek was personally served with
3 this notice on January 31st, which meets the notice
4 time requirements of both the Commission's regulations
5 and the open meeting law.

6 Exhibit C is a personnel action report,
7 which is the report that's sent to the POST Commission
8 indicating when some -- there has been a change in
9 employment. This particular personnel action report
10 shows that Mr. Peek's employment was terminated or he
11 was separated from his agency, and it indicates that
12 there is a reason for that separation that could lead
13 to revocation of his POST certificate.

14 Exhibit D is a letter from the chief of the
15 Lyon County Sheriff indicating the background, a
16 little bit of the background on Mr. Peek's situation
17 and requesting that his POST certification be revoked
18 for the activity underlying the felony conviction.

19 Exhibit E is the basic -- is Mr. Peek's
20 basic certificate, which shows he has a Category I
21 basic certificate. And Exhibit F is his Category III
22 basic certificate. Those are the two certifications
23 that the Commission would be taking action on today,
24 if that's the decision of the Commission.

25 Exhibit G is the information. That's the

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1 original information that was filed in the criminal
2 case. You'll see there essentially what the factual
3 basis for those convictions have had to do -- or for
4 those charges had to do with activity taking place in
5 the jail, inappropriate activity between Mr. Peek and
6 a number of inmates in the jail facility.

7 The particular crimes that were charged, as
8 you could see, are coercion, asking or receiving a
9 bribe by a public officer employee, voluntary sexual
10 conduct between a prisoner and another person,
11 preventing or dissuading a victim from reporting a
12 crime, and commencing prosecution or causing arrest,
13 and finally open or gross -- open or gross lewdness
14 and indecent exposure. That's the charges that the
15 case began with.

16 Exhibit H is the amended criminal
17 information, which is the charge that Mr. Peek pled
18 guilty to. It indicates that the charge that he, you
19 will see, eventually pled guilty to is misconduct of a
20 public officer, a Category E felony. The information
21 alleges that between January 25th of 2013 and August
22 2nd of 2013, Mr. Peek was employed as a detention
23 deputy at the Lyon County Detention Center, that he
24 did willfully unlawfully use his official position to
25 direct or receive compensation from individuals under

1 his control or direction for his own private benefit
2 in exchange for omitting or deferring the performance
3 of his official duties. That's essentially the extent
4 of the factual information we have, but we know that
5 he's been charged in that information with a felony, a
6 Category E felony.

7 Exhibit I is a certified copy of a notice to
8 vacate the trial based on the guilty plea, that is
9 Exhibit J, where Mr. Peek agrees to plead guilty to
10 that charge of misconduct of a public officer.

11 Exhibit K is the judgment and sentence.
12 That shows that a conviction has occurred, that
13 Mr. Peek was convicted of misconduct of a public
14 officer, a Category E felony, in violation of NRS
15 197.110. That was signed by the judge on January 5th
16 of 2018. Mr. Peek was sentenced to 12 to 45 months in
17 the Nevada Department of Corrections. That sentence
18 was suspended and he was placed on probation for a
19 term not to exceed 5 years, along with other fees
20 associated with that conviction.

21 Based on the evidence and information, and
22 the Commission's regulations which provide the
23 mandatory revocation upon felony conviction, and based
24 on the serious nature of the criminal conduct that's
25 charged in this case which specifically involved

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1 activity by this individual in a peace officer
2 capacity against women under his supervision or
3 control in a detention facility, it would be the
4 recommendation that his POST certification be revoked.
5 And as part of that, I would ask, Mr. Chairman, that
6 Exhibits A through K be admitted into the record in
7 support of any action that may be taken today.

8 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you, Mike.
9 Yes, the exhibits are approved and certainly accepted.

10 Do we have anybody in the audience who would
11 like to talk about this personally or to represent
12 him, or is he here? Okay, seeing none. To the
13 Commissioners, does anybody have any comments or
14 anything they'd like to say? All right, looking for a
15 motion.

16 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner. I'll
17 make a motion to revoke Mr. Peek's Category I and III
18 basic certificates.

19 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, Chief. Do I
20 have a second?

21 COMMISSIONER McGRATH: Chief McGrath. I'll
22 second.

23 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Any other
24 comments? All in favor?

25 (Ayes.)

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1 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you very
2 much.

3 Okay, now we're going to go on to number 7,
4 and that's discussion, public comment, and also for
5 possible action: Hearing pursuant to NAC
6 289.290(1)(g), that's suspend Jeffrey J. [sic] Grasso,
7 formerly with the Boulder County Police Department,
8 certification based on a criminal complaint of a
9 Category C felony. The Commission is to decide
10 whether to suspend. And if you could, Mike, go
11 through it?

12 MR. JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Mike
13 Jensen again for the record. This particular hearing
14 differs from the previous hearing in the sense that
15 there has not been a conviction in this particular
16 criminal case yet. This is a situation where the
17 Commission would be proceeding under NAC 289.290,
18 which provides that upon the filing of a criminal
19 indictment or criminal information for a felony, that
20 the Commission may suspend an individual's POST
21 certification. That suspension would be pending the
22 outcome of any criminal proceedings, so it would be
23 dependent on what happened in his criminal proceeding
24 as to whether that suspension would turn into a
25 revocation upon conviction, if that were to occur.

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1 The exhibits are behind agenda item
2 number 7. I'll just again real briefly go through
3 these exhibits.

4 Again, Exhibit A is the notice that we
5 talked about in last hearing, where Mr. Grasso was
6 informed of this particular hearing today and the
7 potential for a suspension of his POST certification
8 pending the outcome of his criminal case, and gives
9 him all of the other information that was discussed in
10 the previous hearing with regard to the date, time,
11 and location of this hearing, his opportunity to
12 appear and present any witnesses or evidence, and
13 cross-examine witnesses, as well as the requirement
14 that he inform the Commission within 15 days prior to
15 the hearing -- 15 days prior to the hearing if he
16 would be appearing to contest the action in any way.
17 And the scope of the hearing being whether his POST
18 certification should be suspended for an indictment on
19 felony charges.

20 Exhibit B is the declaration of service
21 showing that Mr. Grasso's attorney in this particular
22 case was served with the notice of revocation, of
23 intent to suspend, and that that took place on
24 January 31, 2018, which is within the notice date
25 requirements of both the NAC 289 and NRS 239.

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1 Exhibit C and D are the letters from the
2 Boulder City Police, of Chief Timothy Shea, providing
3 some of the background information and requesting that
4 the Commission consider suspending Mr. Grasso's POST
5 certification pending the outcome of the criminal
6 proceeding.

7 Exhibit E is his basic certificate, which is
8 a Category I in lieu basic certificate. It's a
9 Category I certificate.

10 And then we get into the criminal court
11 documents. The first is the original indictment.
12 Exhibit F is the original indictment which shows the
13 charges that have been -- that Mr. Grasso has been
14 indicted on. Looking through those, I won't go
15 through them all, but there are 14 counts of felony
16 counts which include charges for exploitation of a
17 vulnerable person, a Category B felony; theft, a
18 Category B felony; forgery, a Category B felony;
19 burglary, a Category B felony; offering a false
20 instrument for a filing -- for filing a record, a
21 Category C felony, which are all alleged to have
22 occurred in Clark County between January 2, 2014 and
23 February 16th of 2016.

24 Because this is a case where there hasn't
25 been a conviction yet, this is the document that the

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1 Commission would be relying for any action it may take
2 today to suspend Mr. Grasso's POST certification. As
3 you can see, looking at those particular charges, they
4 are serious allegations against a peace officer having
5 allegedly committed a crime against a wheelchair-bound
6 vulnerable person who suffers from traumatic brain
7 injury, through burglary, theft, and forgery. And
8 indicates in those charges the allegation being that
9 he did so in order to obtain a thing of value for his
10 own purposes.

11 Based on the seriousness of the criminal
12 conducts that's charged and the Commission's authority
13 to suspend pending the outcome of the criminal case,
14 it's the recommendation that Mr. Grasso's POST
15 certification be suspended, again pending the outcome
16 of his criminal case, based on these 14 criminal
17 charges.

18 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, Mike,
19 appreciate that. Anybody in the audience who would
20 like to comment on that? How about commissioners? I
21 just want to also mention this is not the first time
22 we've done that as far as dealing with a suspend thing
23 instead of an already been -- he's been arrested and
24 then also the courts have already settled that, so
25 that isn't the case. The thing of it is when we look

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1 at things like this that is high risk, then we
2 obviously look at the suspended end of it.

3 So I just wanted to ask if anybody here
4 would like to make any comments on that? Okay,
5 looking for a motion?

6 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: Kevin McKinney. I
7 move we suspend --

8 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank --

9 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: -- the
10 certification.

11 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you. And do
12 I have a second?

13 COMMISSIONER REED: Ben Reed. I'll second
14 it.

15 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Any other comments,
16 questions? Okay, all in favor?

17 (Ayes.)

18 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Anybody opposed? Okay,
19 thank you.

20 Okay. Now we go to more light and fun
21 things now, I think. Yeah. I want to mention number
22 8, if we could, with discussion, public comment, and
23 for possible action: Request from the Las Vegas Metro
24 Police Department for their employee Assistant Sheriff
25 Todd Fasulo for an executive certificate. Is he here,

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1 by chance? Is Todd here? No?

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No.

3 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay. So, Mike, are you
4 going to talk about that or Scott?

5 MR. SHERLOCK: Sure, I can.

6 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay.

7 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
8 record. The Executive Certificate Committee reviewed
9 Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Assistant
10 Sheriff Todd R. Fasulo's application and found he
11 meets the requirements. Staff recommends that the
12 Commission award the executive certificate.

13 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you, Mike.

14 Does anybody in the audience have any
15 comments, questions? Going to our commissioners for a
16 motion or, leastwise, does anybody want to say
17 anything, any comments? No. Okay. Moving on, a
18 motion if we could?

19 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner. I'll
20 make a motion to approve Todd Fasulo for an executive
21 certificate.

22 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay. Do I have a
23 second?

24 COMMISSIONER McGRATH: John McGrath. I'll
25 second.

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1 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Any other
2 comments or questions? All in favor?

3 (Ayes.)

4 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Anybody opposed? So
5 carried, thank you.

6 Okay, we're going to go to number 9 now.
7 This is a discussion, public comment, and for possible
8 action: Request from Las Vegas Metro Police
9 Department for their employee Captain Christopher
10 Little for an executive certificate. Mike?

11 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
12 record. Again, the Executive Certification Committee
13 reviewed Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's
14 Captain Christopher Little application and found that
15 he does also meet the requirements. And staff
16 recommends that the Commission award the executive
17 certificate to Captain Little.

18 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you.

19 Anybody in the audience would like to make
20 comment, question? Same for the commissioners,
21 anybody have any questions or comments? How about a
22 motion, please? I need a motion.

23 COMMISSIONER McGRATH: John McGrath. I'll
24 make a motion to approve his certificate.

25 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, we have a motion.

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1 Do we have a second?

2 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner. I'll
3 second.

4 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, Troy.
5 Any other comments? Okay, all in favor?
6 (Ayes.)

7 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Any opposed? So carried.
8 Thank you.

9 Number 10, discussion, public comment, and
10 for possible action: Request from the first Judicial
11 District Court, Carson City Juvenile Justice --
12 Services for their employee Chief Banister for the
13 executive certificate. So, Mike, I think that's on
14 you again.

15 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
16 record. Once again, the Executive Certificate
17 Committee reviewed Carson City Juvenile Services Chief
18 Ali Banister's application and found she meets the
19 requirements. And staff recommends that the
20 Commission issue or award the executive certificate to
21 Chief Banister.

22 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you, Mike.

23 Anybody in the audience would like to
24 comment, questions? Okay, how about the
25 commissioners, any questions or any comments? All

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1 right, looking for a motion.

2 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner. I'll
3 make a motion to approve Chief Banister's executive
4 certificate.

5 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Do I have a
6 second?

7 COMMISSIONER REED: Ben Reed. I'll second
8 it.

9 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Any other
10 comments or questions? All in favor?

11 (Ayes.)

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Anybody opposed? So
13 carried. Thank you.

14 We're going to go to number 11 then.
15 Discussion, public comment, and for possible action:
16 Request from the Nevada Department of Public Safety
17 for employee Captain Sheri -- we spelled it wrong.
18 It's S-i-l-v-a. So we had that wrong on there, I
19 apologize -- for an executive certificate. Mike, are
20 you up on that one?

21 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, again. I'm
22 not sure -- so sure doing all in Mesquite worked out.
23 I don't think any of them have shown up.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: No, we have --

25 MR. SHERLOCK: Oh, yeah. All right, good

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1 deal. Thank you. Thank you.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good job, Mike.

3 Great job, Mike. Thanks for coming.

4 (Applause.)

5 MR. SHERLOCK: All right. Sliva, it is,
6 right?

7 CAPTAIN SLIVA: Sliva, S-l-i-v-a.

8 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, we kind of messed
9 that up. I apologize.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's right. It's
11 correct.

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: It's correct.

13 MR. SHERLOCK: Once again, the Executive
14 Certificate Committee reviewed the Department of
15 Public Safety's Captain Sheri Sliva's application and
16 found that she meets the requirements. And staff does
17 recommend that the Commission award the certificate to
18 Captain Sliva.

19 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, Mike, I
20 appreciate that.

21 Anybody in the audience, except for you,
22 Sheri, anybody else here would like to say anything,
23 comments? Okay, how about to the commissioners,
24 anybody like to make a comment or question, or
25 anything like that? All right, looking for a motion.

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1 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: James Wright. I'm
2 pleased to make a motion to award the executive
3 certificate to Sheri Sliva.

4 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Do I have a
5 second?

6 COMMISSIONER TANNER: Troy Tanner. Second.

7 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: All right, any other
8 questions or comments? All in favor?

9 (Ayes.)

10 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Congratulations, come on
11 up. There you go, Sheri. Thank you so much for doing
12 that.

13 CAPTAIN SLIVA: Thank you so much. I
14 appreciate it.

15 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you.

16 (Applause.)

17 CAPTAIN SLIVA: Thank you so much.

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good job.
19 Congratulations.

20 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Sheri, I just want to say
21 that executive certificate is the highest we have. So
22 you know what, that's a big thing, it is. It means a
23 lot. You've worked hard at what you do to get that
24 far and we appreciate that.

25 CAPTAIN SLIVA: Thank you so much. And it's

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1 especially significant because just a few days ago was
2 my 20th anniversary with DPS, so it's really a special
3 time to get it. And I appreciate it so much. Thank
4 you.

5 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you.
6 Appreciate that.

7 Okay, we're going to go to number 12 now.
8 This is discussion, public comment, and for possible
9 action: Request from the Carson City Sheriff's Office
10 for their employee Assistant Sheriff Jerome
11 Bushbant --

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Tushbant.

13 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, of the
14 executive certificate. I see that you're there.
15 Okay, Mike?

16 MR. SHERLOCK: Mike Sherlock, for the
17 record. Again, one last time, the Executive
18 Certificate Committee reviewed Carson City Assistant
19 Sheriff Jerome Tushbant's application and found that
20 he does meet the requirements. And staff does
21 recommend that the Commission award the executive
22 certificate to Assistant Sheriff Jerome Tushbant.

23 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Anybody in
24 the audience? Maybe Kenny, if you want to say
25 something?

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1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No, no.

2 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Are you okay?

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah, I just -- I
4 appreciate everything (indiscernible) --

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We trained him for
6 this.

7 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: I get it now. Okay, I
8 understand. All right. Okay, anybody else in the
9 audience? Okay, thank you. Commissioners, do you
10 have any comments or anything you'd like to say?
11 Looking for a motion.

12 COMMISSIONER WRIGHT: James Wright. I'll
13 make a motion to award Jerome Tushbant the executive
14 certificate.

15 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Do I have a
16 second?

17 COMMISSIONER REED: Ben Reed --

18 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: Kevin McKinney.
19 I'll second.

20 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: I'm sorry, which one?

21 COMMISSIONER REED: Oh, go ahead.

22 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: Kevin McKinney.
23 I'll second.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Anybody,
25 comments or any questions? All in favor?

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1 (Ayes.)

2 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Any opposed? So carried.
3 Thank you.

4 Going to number 13 now. This is for
5 discussion, public comment, and for possible action:
6 Request from the Nevada Department of Corrections for
7 their employees for a 6-month extension past the 1-
8 year requirement in order to meet the requirements for
9 certification for the following employees. And I
10 understand you're here representing them?

11 MS. DELPORTO: Yes, I am.

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay.

13 MS. DELPORTO: For the record, Pam DelPorto,
14 Inspector General for the Nevada Department of
15 Corrections.

16 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you, I appreciate
17 that. And maybe, Scott, if you could go ahead and
18 list the names of those six?

19 MR. JOHNSTON: Sure. Scott Johnston for the
20 record. The Department of Corrections has six
21 officers that they're requesting a 6-month extension
22 to. I apologize now if I pronounce the names
23 incorrectly.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Why do you think I passed
25 it on?

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1 (Laughter.)

2 MR. JOHNSTON: Kolada Ajulo, Jose Aguayo,
3 Christopher Christensen, Justin Hanna, Mark Romero,
4 and Cody Sunday.

5 And going up to Kolada, he was hired on
6 March 13th of 2017, and with a 6-month extension, that
7 would extend his eligibility time to become certified
8 out to September 13th of 2018.

9 And on Jose Aguayo, he was hired on 7/3 of
10 '17, and a 6-month extension would extend his
11 eligibility out to January 3rd of 2019.

12 Christopher Christensen was hired on
13 April 10th of 2017, and a 6-month extension would
14 extend his eligibility out to October 10th of 2018.

15 Justin Hanna was hired on May 8, 2017. A
16 6-month extension would extend his time out to
17 November 8th of 2018.

18 And Mark Romero was hired on June 19, 2017,
19 and a 6-month extension would extend his time period
20 out to December 19th of 2018.

21 And Cody Sunday was hired 4/10 of '17. A
22 6-month extension would extend his time out to
23 October 10th of 2018.

24 And I believe the agency representative here
25 has the conditions behind what has led to being on the

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1 agenda today.

2 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: If I could ask you
3 something just for a minute, Scott. We got
4 information from that via letter and saying this is
5 what the issues are and --

6 MR. JOHNSTON: That is correct. The
7 Department of Corrections had submitted a letter that
8 you have in your commission books outlining some of
9 the circumstances behind the hardships that they've
10 endured and were not able to fulfill those officers in
11 through an academy.

12 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Thank you. Please.

13 MS. DELPORTO: Thank you. And please
14 understand I'm not in the training division, however,
15 I am their voice today. Because all six of these
16 staff members currently their duty station is Ely
17 State Prison, we're not at the luxury of having enough
18 staff to put on an academy at all times, and
19 especially given our budgetary shortfalls right now.
20 So with that said, I did ask today if there was, and
21 in anticipation that you would ask me, the anticipated
22 date would be as early as July of 2018, which starts
23 the new fiscal funding year for the state.

24 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: All right. Does anybody
25 here as far as maybe out in the audience, maybe I

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1 should ask that first, any questions on that? Seeing
2 none, we'll go to the commissioners, if we could.
3 Does anybody have any questions about that particular
4 topic?

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: She just answered my
6 question, which was what's the relief in sight. So
7 next budget, coming budget cycle?

8 MS. DELPORTO: Yes, sir.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you.

10 COMMISSIONER TANNER: And Troy Tanner, for
11 the record. I don't think we've ever given a second
12 extension, as far as I know, since I've been on the
13 Commission, so -- yeah, I would worry as a chief, I
14 guess, and I understand budget shortfalls, but to go
15 that long period of time, you know, we don't -- we
16 don't even hire anyone anymore until the academy is
17 lined up. But I get everyone is in a different
18 circumstance. But at the same time, I'd just simply
19 -- a lot of liability for administration in my mind,
20 but, anyway, that's my two cents.

21 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: I think one of the things
22 that we appreciate is you coming up, as we do any
23 agency that has some kind of a problem similar to this
24 to come and explain why we need to have the extension.
25 We really want to have that, the commissioners, a lot.

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1 Saying we always want that, but we don't have a reason
2 for it. So we appreciate that.

3 All right. So we're going to look for a
4 motion. Okay, I'll make it easier, just say six
5 names, how's that? We don't have to say that, okay.
6 So what would you like to do? Do we want to do a
7 motion on that, if we could deal with those?

8 COMMISSIONER MCKINNEY: Kevin McKinney.
9 I'll make a motion we grant a 6-month extension for
10 all six of these Department of Correction employees.

11 CHAIRMAN PIERINI: Okay, thank you. And do
12 I have a second?

13 COMMISSIONER REED: Ben Reed. I'll second
