NOTICE OF WORKSHOP TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS

The Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training, 5587 Wa Pai Shone Avenue, Carson City, Nevada, Telephone Number (775) 687-7678, is proposing the Adoption, Amendment and Repeal of regulations pertaining to Chapter 289 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

Notice is hereby given that starting at 1:00 pm, on Thursday July 24, 2014, there will be a Workshop at the Prospector Hotel and Casino, Ghost Train Room, 1501 E. Aultman, Ely Nevada.

The purpose of the workshop is to solicit comments from interested persons on the following general topic that may be addressed in the proposed regulations:

TOPIC

NAC REGULATION

A. Proposed amendment of NAC 289.200, the regulation establishing standards for the Executive Director to award a basic certificate to a peace officer, to revise the language regarding the score required to pass the state certification exam from "a score at or above the 70th percentile" to "a score of at least 70 percent." Additionally, a proposed amendment of NAC 289.200 to correctly reflect the name of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center to the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers of the United States Department of Homeland Security.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption, Amendment and Repeal

Of

Regulations of the Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training

PUBLIC COMMENT HEARING NOTICE: The Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training ("Commission") will hold a public hearing at 1:00 p.m., on July 24, 2014, at the Prospector Hotel and Casino, Ghost Train Room, 1501 E. Aultman, Ely, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption, amendment and repeal of regulations that pertain to Chapter 289 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC).

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. **A statement of the need for and purpose of the proposed regulations.**

NRS Chapter 289 authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations setting the minimum standards for the certification, decertification and selection of peace officers. See, NRS 289.510. The Commission has adopted regulations establishing the grounds for the suspension or revocation of a peace officer's POST certification. See, NAC 289.290. The proposed regulation will add grounds for suspension or revocation when a peace officer has entered a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to a gross misdemeanor or felony. The proposed regulation will authorize the Commission to suspend or revoke a peace officer's POST certificate upon entry of a plea even if there is no conviction entered for the gross misdemeanor or felony conviction. The proposed regulation also removes the requirement that a peace officer complete six units of credit from an accredited college or university to obtain a Management Certificate. See, NAC 289.260. Finally, the proposed regulation repeals the regulation providing for the issuance of an Instruction Certificate. See, NAC 289.280. The need for the proposed regulation changes is to provide the Commission with another tool to ensure peace officers who commit acts constituting a felony or gross misdemeanor may have their POST certification suspended or revoked. Additionally, through this proposed regulation, the Commission and law enforcement leaders are attempting to increase professionalism amongst law enforcement officers, and provide clarity and consistency in those regulations.

The proposed regulation, referenced as LCB File No. R051-14, contain the following sections:

Section 1. Amending NAC 289.260(6) which contains the requirements for a Management Certificate to remove the requirement for six *units of credit from an accredited college or university*. The Intermediate and Advanced Certificates already have higher education requirements. The removal of this wording is needed to remove a conflict with the new standards. Making this change will properly align the Management Certificate with the Intermediate and Advanced Certificates.

Section 2. Amending NAC 289.290(1)(e) and (1)(g), which identify circumstances which constitute causes for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer.

1. Change subsection (1)(e) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a gross misdemeanor.
2. Change subsection (1)(g) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a felony.

Section 3. Repeal NAC 289.280 which establishes the standards for an Instruction Certificate. The Commission is repealing this regulation because an Instruction Certificate has been found to be unnecessary to improve the quality of instruction of peace officers.

2. **Either the terms, or the substance of the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed, or a description of the subjects and issues involved.**

The proposed regulations, referenced as LCB File NO. R051-14, contain the following sections:

Section 1. Amending NAC 289.260(6) which contains the requirements for a Management Certificate, to remove the requirement for *six units of credit from an accredited college or university*. The Intermediate and Advanced Certificates already have higher education requirements. The removal of this wording is needed to remove a conflict with the new standards. Making this change will properly align the Management Certificate with the Intermediate and Advanced Certificates.

Section 2. Amending NAC 289.290(1)(e) and (1)(g), which identify circumstances which constitute causes for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer.

1. Change subsection (1)(e) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a gross misdemeanor.
2. Change subsection (1)(g) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a felony.

Section 3. Repeal NAC 289.280 which establishes the standards for an Instruction Certificate. The Commission is repealing this regulation because an Instruction Certificate has been found to be unnecessary to improve the quality of instruction of peace officers.

3. **The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public. These must be stated separately and in each case must include:**

(a) Both adverse and beneficial effects; and

- (1) Adverse effects:

There are no anticipated adverse effects.

(2) Beneficial effects:

The amendment to the regulations should lead to an increased level of professionalism among peace officers employed by law enforcement agencies. The proposed regulations will ensure the Commission can revoke or suspend the POST certification of peace officers who have engaged in serious criminal behavior. The proposed regulations will also provide consistency in the requirements for the Management, Intermediate and Advanced certificates.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

There are no negative immediate and long term effects.

4. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

The Commission does not project any extra costs for enforcement the proposed regulations.

5. A description of and citation to any regulations of other states or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. If the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, the notice must include the name of the regulating federal agency.

The proposed regulation does not overlap or duplicate any regulations of state, local or federal governmental agency regulating the same activity.

6. If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, a citation and description of the federal law.

The proposed regulation is not required by federal law.

7. If the regulation includes provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, a summary of such provision.

There are no federal regulations that regulate the same activity.

8. Whether the proposed regulation establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee.

This regulation does not involve or establish fees.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to Richard Clark, Executive Director, POST Commission, 5587 Wa Pai Shone Avenue, Carson City, Nevada 89701. **Written submissions must be received by the POST Commission on or before 5:00 pm on July 15, 2014.** If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

A copy of this notice and the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed will be on file at the State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed will

be available at the POST Commission Administrative Offices, 5587 Wai Pai Shone Avenue, Carson City, 89701, and in all counties in which an office of the agency is not maintained, at the main public library, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. This notice and the text of the proposed regulations are also available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations, which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau pursuant to NRS 233B.0653, and on the Internet at <http://www.leg.state.nv.us> , on the Nevada Public Notice web site at <https://notice.nv.gov> and on the POST web site at post.nv.gov. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if it is deemed necessary.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

**REVISED PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE PEACE
OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING COMMISSION**

LCB File No. R051-14

June 11, 2014

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-3, NRS 289.510.

A REGULATION relating to peace officers; revising the requirements for the granting of a management certificate to a peace officer; revising provisions governing the suspension, refusal or revocation of a certificate as a peace officer; repealing provisions providing for the issuance and maintenance of an instruction certificate; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest

Existing law requires the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510) Under existing regulations, the requirements a peace officer must satisfy to obtain a management certificate include, without limitation, a requirement that the officer obtain intermediate and advanced certificates. (NAC 289.260) An officer may obtain intermediate and advanced certificates by satisfying certain requirements, including, without limitation, the completion of a certain number units of credit at a college or university, a certain number of years of experience or certain combinations of both. (NAC 289.240 and 289.250, as amended by sections 2 and 3, respectively, of LCB File No. R188-12) **Section 1** of this regulation removes the requirement that an officer must successfully complete at least six units of college or university credit to obtain a management certificate. Thus, under **section 1**, an officer who obtained the intermediate and advanced certificates through obtaining years of experience would not be required to successfully complete college or university credits to obtain a management certificate.

Under existing regulations, a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer is convicted of a crime. (NAC 289.290) **Section 2** of this regulation provides that a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to a felony or gross misdemeanor. Thus, under **section 2**, a peace officer's certificate may be suspended, refused or revoked if he or

she: (1) is convicted of, or pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to, a felony or gross misdemeanor; or (2) is convicted of a misdemeanor.

Section 3 of this regulation repeals provisions of existing regulations which establish requirements for the issuance and maintenance of instruction certificates.

Section 1. NAC 289.260 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.260 The Executive Director shall grant a management certificate to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

1. A current basic certificate.
2. A current intermediate certificate.
3. A current advanced certificate.
4. A current supervisor certificate.
5. Six years of experience as a peace officer, including at least 1 year of experience in a management level position and a current assignment in a management level position. The applicant must present proof that the current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057 by submitting a letter with the application that is signed by the administrator of the agency. The letter must include an organizational chart which demonstrates the applicant's position within the agency and must describe the manner in which the applicant's current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057.
6. ~~Six units of credit from an accredited college or university.~~

~~74~~ Successful completion of 200 hours of training in a management training program certified by the Commission which includes, without limitation, courses in the following subjects:

- (a) Introduction to management;
- (b) Public administration;
- (c) Financial administration;
- (d) Personnel administration;
- (e) Management and labor relations; and
- (f) Policy formulation.

Sec. 2. NAC 289.290 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.290 1. Each of the following constitutes cause for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer:

- (a) Willful falsification of any information provided to obtain the certificate.
- (b) A permanent or chronic physical or mental disability affecting the officer's ability to perform his or her full range of duties.
- (c) Chronic drinking or drunkenness on duty.
- (d) Addiction to or the unlawful use or possession of narcotics or other drugs.
- (e) Conviction of , *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a gross misdemeanor. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed.
- (f) Failure to comply with the standards established in this chapter.

(g) Conviction of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a felony. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed. Upon conviction ~~or~~ *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere,* the certificate will be revoked.

(h) Conviction of a misdemeanor. If the employing agency recommends suspension or revocation following conviction of the employee for a misdemeanor, suspension or revocation may be imposed. In determining whether to suspend or revoke the certificate, the Commission will consider the type of conviction and other information provided by the agency indicating unprofessional conduct or similar undesirable activity by the officer that resulted in disciplinary action.

2. Denial, suspension or revocation procedures will not be considered by the Commission in cases where the employment of an officer is terminated for violations of the policies, general orders or similar guidelines of operation of the employing agency which do not constitute any of the causes for denial, suspension or revocation specified in subsection 1.

3. The employing agency shall notify the Commission any time that it becomes aware that one of its officers has been charged with a crime that could result in denial, suspension or revocation procedures. Upon receipt of information alleging any of the causes enumerated in subsection 1, the Commission will determine whether to pursue revocation or suspension of the certificate of the officer.

4. The Commission will notify the officer by certified mail at the officer's last known address of any pending revocation or suspension action and of the nature of the charges and the officer's right to appear and answer the charges. The officer shall, within 15 days after the date

on the certified mail receipt, respond in writing, notifying the Commission of his or her intended action with reference to the charges.

5. If the officer fails to notify the Commission within the specified time of his or her intention to appear in answer to the pending action, the Commission will:

(a) Consider the case on its own merits, using the statement from the head of the employing agency or the substantiated information derived from any independent investigation it deems necessary;

(b) Take no action pending the outcome of possible criminal action which may be filed against the officer; and

(c) Take no action pending the outcome of an appeal.

⇒ The Commission's decision will be determined by a majority vote of the members of the Commission present.

6. When an officer notifies the Commission of his or her intention to appear and answer the charges pending against him or her, the Commission will elect to sit as a whole at a hearing or designate an independent hearing officer to hear the matter and make recommendations in writing to the Commission. The Commission will review the recommendations of any such hearing officer and arrive at a decision by majority vote of the members present.

7. The Commission will notify the officer of its decision within 15 days after the hearing.

8. An applicant for a certificate who has not been previously certified, but who would be subject to revocation for any cause set out in subsection 1, will not be granted a certificate.

9. If, upon receiving a written allegation that a peace officer is in violation of any provision of subsection 1 and that the facts and circumstances indicate that suspension rather than

revocation would be in the best interests of the agency and law enforcement in general, the Commission will suspend the officer's certificate.

10. The Commission will provide each peace officer whose certificate is suspended with written notice of the suspension by certified registered mail. The suspension becomes effective 24 hours after receipt of the certified notice. The notice will contain a statement advising the officer of the right to a hearing.

11. Suspension of a certificate is not a bar to future revocation of the certificate and any prior suspensions may be considered as a factor if revocation is being considered by the Commission.

12. Five years after the revocation of a certificate, an officer may submit a written request to the Commission to allow him or her to reinstate his or her certificate. The Commission will schedule a hearing to consider whether to reinstate the officer's certificate. The Commission will notify the agency that requested the revocation of the date and time of the hearing. After the hearing, the Commission will determine whether to reinstate the certificate. If the certificate is reinstated, the Commission may establish a probationary period during which any misconduct by the officer would result in revocation.

Sec. 3. NAC 289.280 is hereby repealed.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

289.280 Instruction certificate. (NRS 289.510)

1. The Executive Director shall grant an instruction certificate in a specific subject to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

(a) Two years of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued or 2 years of education and 1 year of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued.

(b) Successful completion of a formal course of instruction in the:

(1) Subject for which the certificate is issued; and

(2) Development of instructors.

(c) Development and submission for approval by the Executive Director of a detailed lesson plan for the subject for which the certificate is issued, including, without limitation, objectives for the performance of the students that can be measured with a written or practical examination.

(d) Submission to the Executive Director of a current written résumé covering the areas of:

(1) Personal identification;

(2) Educational experience;

(3) Work experience;

(4) Teaching experience; and

(5) Recommendation of the employing agency.

↳ Instructors may also be certified on the basis of extraordinary experience, education or expertise in an unusually technical subject area.

2. To maintain an instructor certificate, an instructor must teach at least one class in the subject for which the certificate is issued during the year immediately preceding each anniversary date of the issuance of the certificate. An instructor must provide evidence of compliance with this requirement upon the request of the Executive Director.

(4) Teaching experience; and

(5) Recommendation of the employing agency.

↳ Instructors may also be certified on the basis of extraordinary experience, education or expertise in an unusually technical subject area.

2. To maintain an instructor certificate, an instructor must teach at least one class in the subject for which the certificate is issued during the year immediately preceding each anniversary date of the issuance of the certificate. An instructor must provide evidence of compliance with this requirement upon the request of the Executive Director.

**REVISED PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE PEACE
OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING COMMISSION**

LCB File No. R051-14

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-3, NRS 289.510.

A REGULATION relating to peace officers; revising the requirements for the granting of a management certificate to a peace officer; revising provisions governing the suspension, refusal or revocation of a certificate as a peace officer; repealing provisions providing for the issuance and maintenance of an instruction certificate; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest

Existing law requires the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510) Under existing regulations, the requirements a peace officer must satisfy to obtain a management certificate include, without limitation, a requirement that the officer obtain intermediate and advanced certificates. (NAC 289.260) An officer may obtain intermediate and advanced certificates by satisfying certain requirements, including, without limitation, the completion of a certain number units of credit at a college or university, a certain number of years of experience or certain combinations of both. (NAC 289.240 and 289.250, as amended by sections 2 and 3, respectively, of LCB File No. R188-12) **Section 1** of this regulation removes the requirement that an officer must successfully complete at least six units of college or university credit to obtain a management certificate. Thus, under **section 1**, an officer who obtained the intermediate and advanced certificates through obtaining years of experience would not be required to successfully complete college or university credits to obtain a management certificate.

Under existing regulations, a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer is convicted of a crime. (NAC 289.290) **Section 2** of this regulation provides that a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to a felony or gross misdemeanor. Thus, under **section 2**, a peace officer's certificate may be suspended, refused or revoked if he or

she: (1) is convicted of, or pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to, a felony or gross misdemeanor; or (2) is convicted of a misdemeanor.

Section 3 of this regulation repeals provisions of existing regulations which establish requirements for the issuance and maintenance of instruction certificates.

Section 1. NAC 289.260 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.260 The Executive Director shall grant a management certificate to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

1. A current basic certificate.
2. A current intermediate certificate.
3. A current advanced certificate.
4. A current supervisor certificate.
5. Six years of experience as a peace officer, including at least 1 year of experience in a management level position and a current assignment in a management level position. The applicant must present proof that the current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057 by submitting a letter with the application that is signed by the administrator of the agency. The letter must include an organizational chart which demonstrates the applicant's position within the agency and must describe the manner in which the applicant's current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057.
6. ~~Six units of credit from an accredited college or university.~~

~~74~~ Successful completion of 200 hours of training in a management training program certified by the Commission which includes, without limitation, courses in the following subjects:

- (a) Introduction to management;
- (b) Public administration;
- (c) Financial administration;
- (d) Personnel administration;
- (e) Management and labor relations; and
- (f) Policy formulation.

Sec. 2. NAC 289.290 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.290 1. Each of the following constitutes cause for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer:

- (a) Willful falsification of any information provided to obtain the certificate.
- (b) A permanent or chronic physical or mental disability affecting the officer's ability to perform his or her full range of duties.
- (c) Chronic drinking or drunkenness on duty.
- (d) Addiction to or the unlawful use or possession of narcotics or other drugs.
- (e) Conviction of , *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a gross misdemeanor. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed.
- (f) Failure to comply with the standards established in this chapter.

(g) Conviction of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a felony. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed. Upon conviction ~~or~~ *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere,* the certificate will be revoked.

(h) Conviction of a misdemeanor. If the employing agency recommends suspension or revocation following conviction of the employee for a misdemeanor, suspension or revocation may be imposed. In determining whether to suspend or revoke the certificate, the Commission will consider the type of conviction and other information provided by the agency indicating unprofessional conduct or similar undesirable activity by the officer that resulted in disciplinary action.

2. Denial, suspension or revocation procedures will not be considered by the Commission in cases where the employment of an officer is terminated for violations of the policies, general orders or similar guidelines of operation of the employing agency which do not constitute any of the causes for denial, suspension or revocation specified in subsection 1.

3. The employing agency shall notify the Commission any time that it becomes aware that one of its officers has been charged with a crime that could result in denial, suspension or revocation procedures. Upon receipt of information alleging any of the causes enumerated in subsection 1, the Commission will determine whether to pursue revocation or suspension of the certificate of the officer.

4. The Commission will notify the officer by certified mail at the officer's last known address of any pending revocation or suspension action and of the nature of the charges and the officer's right to appear and answer the charges. The officer shall, within 15 days after the date

on the certified mail receipt, respond in writing, notifying the Commission of his or her intended action with reference to the charges.

5. If the officer fails to notify the Commission within the specified time of his or her intention to appear in answer to the pending action, the Commission will:

(a) Consider the case on its own merits, using the statement from the head of the employing agency or the substantiated information derived from any independent investigation it deems necessary;

(b) Take no action pending the outcome of possible criminal action which may be filed against the officer; and

(c) Take no action pending the outcome of an appeal.

⇒ The Commission's decision will be determined by a majority vote of the members of the Commission present.

6. When an officer notifies the Commission of his or her intention to appear and answer the charges pending against him or her, the Commission will elect to sit as a whole at a hearing or designate an independent hearing officer to hear the matter and make recommendations in writing to the Commission. The Commission will review the recommendations of any such hearing officer and arrive at a decision by majority vote of the members present.

7. The Commission will notify the officer of its decision within 15 days after the hearing.

8. An applicant for a certificate who has not been previously certified, but who would be subject to revocation for any cause set out in subsection 1, will not be granted a certificate.

9. If, upon receiving a written allegation that a peace officer is in violation of any provision of subsection 1 and that the facts and circumstances indicate that suspension rather than

revocation would be in the best interests of the agency and law enforcement in general, the Commission will suspend the officer's certificate.

10. The Commission will provide each peace officer whose certificate is suspended with written notice of the suspension by certified registered mail. The suspension becomes effective 24 hours after receipt of the certified notice. The notice will contain a statement advising the officer of the right to a hearing.

11. Suspension of a certificate is not a bar to future revocation of the certificate and any prior suspensions may be considered as a factor if revocation is being considered by the Commission.

12. Five years after the revocation of a certificate, an officer may submit a written request to the Commission to allow him or her to reinstate his or her certificate. The Commission will schedule a hearing to consider whether to reinstate the officer's certificate. The Commission will notify the agency that requested the revocation of the date and time of the hearing. After the hearing, the Commission will determine whether to reinstate the certificate. If the certificate is reinstated, the Commission may establish a probationary period during which any misconduct by the officer would result in revocation.

Sec. 3. NAC 289.280 is hereby repealed.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

289.280 Instruction certificate. (NRS 289.510)

1. The Executive Director shall grant an instruction certificate in a specific subject to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

(a) Two years of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued or 2 years of education and 1 year of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued.

(b) Successful completion of a formal course of instruction in the:

(1) Subject for which the certificate is issued; and

(2) Development of instructors.

(c) Development and submission for approval by the Executive Director of a detailed lesson plan for the subject for which the certificate is issued, including, without limitation, objectives for the performance of the students that can be measured with a written or practical examination.

(d) Submission to the Executive Director of a current written résumé covering the areas of:

(1) Personal identification;

(2) Educational experience;

(3) Work experience;

(4) Teaching experience; and

(5) Recommendation of the employing agency.

↳ Instructors may also be certified on the basis of extraordinary experience, education or expertise in an unusually technical subject area.

2. To maintain an instructor certificate, an instructor must teach at least one class in the subject for which the certificate is issued during the year immediately preceding each anniversary date of the issuance of the certificate. An instructor must provide evidence of compliance with this requirement upon the request of the Executive Director.

10 MICHAEL JENSEN: Mike Jensen. Office of

11 the Attorney General.

12 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Scott Johnson. POST.

13 ELAINE MOORE-CERDA: Elaine Moore-Cerda.

14 POST.

15 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you. And please, I

16 want to make note that Troy Tanner is not present,

17 Tony DeMeo and James Cox. But we do have enough for

18 a quorum. What we're going to start off first is a

19 workshop and, Mike, if you wouldn't mind, please,

20 just outline what a workshop is about real briefly,

21 especially for those who are attending.

22 MICHEAL JENSEN: Sure. Thank you, Mr.

23 Chairman. Mike Jensen for the record. Just real

24 briefly, this is the first hearing in the regulation

25 process. It provides an opportunity when the

1 Commission is looking at potentially changing,
2 modifying or adopting a regulation. It provides an
3 opportunity for interested parties to come together
4 and -- and talk about the -- the potential topics of
5 those regulation changes and is required to
6 eventually, if you go forward to do a regulation
7 change, to -- to complete the process.

8 RONALD PIERINI: Okay, thank you, Mike.

9 And now, what we're going to do on our workshop, and
10 it's going to be probably a pretty brief one, and
11 then we're going to go right into the regular agenda
12 items. And what we're doing is topics under NAC
13 289.200(3). And this is the Commission consider
14 repealing NAC 289.200(3) the regulation established
15 in (inaudible) process for a peace officer holding a
16 Category II Base Certificate to obtain a Category I
17 Basic Certificate upon successful completion of the
18 training course approved by the Executive Director
19 that consists of a minimum of 280 hours specific
20 course topics. Through the repeal of this
21 regulation, the Commission would no longer provide
22 an expedited process for a Category II peace officer
23 to upgrade to a Category I Certificate. Instead, a
24 Category II peace officer would be required to
25 attend a Category I Basic training course to obtain

1 a Category I Basic Certificate. Saying all those
2 things, Scott, if you could outline what that is.

3 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman,
4 Scott Johnston for the record. I'll go over a
5 little bit of history that's led up to the last
6 meeting and this meeting.

7 Back in the early 2000s when the
8 Department of Public Safety then was multiple
9 agencies, when they became one, they were a Category
10 I agency that had both Category I and Category II
11 peace officers. Subsequently, the issue was brought
12 before the Commission and, subsequently, a
13 regulation -- this regulation was drafted to allow
14 agencies who were in such a situation to be able to
15 provide training to take a Category II officer and
16 upgrade them to a Category I. In this case, it fit
17 the specific needs of what the Department of Public
18 Safety desired for. And that went into place.

19 Since that time, there have been other
20 opportunities to utilize this Category II to
21 Category I when other officers that are working with
22 a Category II agency with a Category II Basic
23 Certificate, who had the to desires to excel and
24 broaden their horizons to a Category I for whatever
25 purpose. And that's been allowed for quite some

1 time. The Department of Public Safety trained their
2 personnel and a variety of other agency personnel up
3 to about June 2008. So there's about a five-, six-
4 year window there where they utilized this new
5 regulation at that time to fulfill a need and expand
6 that and make it available to other agencies. Once
7 they were completed with their needs, the -- their
8 program, the two-to-one, they -- it was de-certified
9 at their request and they are no longer providing
10 that training.

11 Subsequently, from 2009 to 2010, the
12 Eighth Judicial District Court picked up the ball to
13 -- and had a program approved so that they could
14 make the training to other agencies that wanted to
15 train their Category IIs to a Category I. And they
16 were in business for doing this for one year. Las
17 Vegas Law Enforcement Academy had a Category II to I
18 for years 2012 and 2013. The Western Nevada State
19 Peace Officers Academy that is normally a Category I
20 and III used this program for one year to open that
21 up to those agencies up here that had that need.
22 Silver State Law Enforcement Academy became active
23 with the II to I to include that with their existing
24 certified academy in 2013 and they are the only
25 academy still remaining in operation providing this

1 service.

2 This was originally brought before the
3 Commission for consideration mainly because of the
4 numbers of officers that were trained. Somewhere
5 near the neighborhood of about 40 of them last year,
6 give or take. Silver State would know the numbers
7 more than I do off the top of my head, but it was in
8 that arena. Back when the program started, DPS had
9 over 100 officers and they trained them. So there
10 was the big push and fulfilled that.

11 Now it's at the point where now the
12 question before the Commission is is there a need
13 for it and should this program continue or not
14 continue. And that's what's open for discussion.

15 At the last workshop, the Commission
16 motioned to continue the rulemaking to continue
17 talking about this to determine what's -- what
18 position it would take on it. That's where we stand
19 with it today. And I do believe Silver State has
20 representatives here who -- they may want to talk
21 and present information to the Commission as well.

22 RONALD PIERINI: Okay, Scott, Thank you.
23 Maybe we should start off with the public, then,
24 first. Then we'll have the Commissioners, if they
25 want, to make any comments on that. Is there

1 anybody in the audience that would like to address
2 this particular issue? Okay, seeing none, moving to
3 the Commissioners. Anybody like to make a comment
4 on that?

5 GARY SCHOFIELD: On behalf -- Troy Tanner
6 asked me to read this letter into the -- the record
7 on behalf of him reference this topic. And I'll
8 just read it verbatim. "Commissioners, dated April
9 28, 2014. Topic, NAC Regulation, NAC 289.203. In
10 regards to Topic A, NAC 289.203I, Commissioner Troy
11 Tanner opposes establishing an expedited process for
12 a peace officer holding a Category II Basic
13 Certificate to obtain a Category I Basic Certificate
14 upon successful completion of a training course
15 approved by the Executive Director that consists of
16 a minimum of 280 hours in specific course topics. I
17 support to not provide an expedited process for
18 Category II peace officer to upgrade to a Category I
19 Certificate. I support that a Category II peace
20 officer would be required to attend a Category I
21 Basic Training Course to obtain a Category I Basic
22 Certificate. I have first-hand experience involving
23 the running and instructing in a Category I academy
24 in Las Vegas. I fully understand the importance of
25 the atmosphere and the pressure that comes with

1 attending a full-time structured academy. I believe
2 it is imperative that we maintain a goal of
3 increasing standards and prevent from lowering
4 standards. I am of the mindset that the cadets'
5 time in the police academy is a valuable period and
6 proving ground for our future law enforcement
7 officers. I believe that a Category I academy
8 should have its own separate curriculum and be an
9 academy without breaks in time. Respectfully, Troy
10 Tanner, Commission/Mesquite Police Department Chief
11 Troy Tanner for the record."

12 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. Thank you. Any
13 other Commissioner want to make any comments on any
14 kind of issues that you would like to bring up?
15 Again, a workshop is an opportunity for us to talk
16 about this particular thing, if we should move
17 forward, if we want to look at the -- the positives
18 and negatives.

19 The only thing that I'm going say is the
20 fact that there is still people that are applying
21 for this particular Category I. If -- if, in my
22 opinion, at least, is that through the last 10
23 years, approximately, that there's been a lot of
24 officers that have upgraded from a II to a I. There
25 was a reason for DPS doing it, to give them more

1 flexibility with the organization to put them in
2 different locations and positions and that they were
3 certified as POST Category I. The only thing that I
4 am against this particular thing, and I'll be real
5 honest with that, is the fact that there is still
6 people applying for that and there is some benefit
7 for those employees to go forward and to be a
8 Category I.

9 We have, what I understand from Mr.
10 Johnston, there, is that we really only have one
11 organization, one private individual corporation
12 that is actually certifying these people to go up to
13 a Category I. And I ask you, Scott, is there any
14 kind of issues out there that -- that this is
15 happening that's not giving them, those people that
16 want to be upgraded to a Category I, any negative
17 information or teaching in their, you know, in the -
18 - in the non-profit -- or I should say in that
19 organization that -- that has that? Is there
20 anything in there that we should know about that
21 they're not giving a good training to those officers
22 to be a Category I?

23 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Scott Johnston for the
24 record. No, Mr. Chairman, the Silver State Law
25 Enforcement Academy is in full compliance with the

1 certification and they run a really good ship and
2 they do put out a good product in their training
3 programs. We don't have any negative reflections on
4 how they operate their business.

5 RONALD PIERINI: Okay, thank you. Anyone
6 else like to make a comment? Okay, seeing none,
7 we're going to go onto the actual regularly
8 scheduled meeting.

1 RONALD PIERINI: We're going to go onto
2 the regular scheduled meeting. And I believe the
3 call order stays the same with what we just did,
4 nobody left, nobody added. So at this time, I think
5 one of the things I would like to have, Director
6 Clark, if you could talk about the new Commission
7 position that we have now vacated.

8 RICHARD CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
9 Dick Clark for the record. We were awaiting the --
10 I guess the approval of the Governor's Office for
11 the -- the candidate who was nominated from the
12 Sheriffs and Chiefs and, unfortunately, we got word
13 back from the Governor's Office that they were --
14 wanted us to look at a Category II individual from
15 the south. Not a particular individual, but the
16 position to be filled from the south. So we're sort
17 of back to square one on that. I've informed the
18 Sheriffs and Chiefs yesterday that we're looking for
19 someone who is Category II that is interested or
20 somebody who knows of somebody who is Category II
21 that would be a good candidate. So that's where we
22 are at this point. And will -- probably will have
23 someone or a couple viable candidates from the south
24 at the July meeting and -- and in conjunction with
25 the Sheriffs and Chiefs, then at that point, the

1 Sheriffs and Chiefs, hopefully, will make a
2 selection out of those candidates to recommend to
3 the Governor. So that's where we are with that
4 position.

5 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. Thank you very
6 much. Going onto Number 4 discussion and public
7 comment and for possible action approval of the
8 minutes from the March 5, 2014, workshop public
9 comment hearing and POST Commission meeting. I
10 would think that the Commissioners have had enough
11 time to be able to look at the last minutes from
12 March 5. Does anyone here on the Commission have
13 any -- any issues with that or changes or any
14 problems with that? Seeing none, asking the public,
15 has anybody had the time to look at that, if you
16 had, do you have any comments you would like to
17 make, you are free to do so.

18 MICHAEL JENSEN: Mr. Chairman, for the
19 record, this is Mike Jensen. I have one proposed
20 changed to the minutes --

21 RONALD PIERINI: Okay.

22 MICHAEL JENSEN: -- on something that I
23 said during the meeting. It's on Page 36 of the
24 minutes on line 14 starting 13 and 14. That
25 sentence that reads, "I would take more of the

1 rating than the regulation," should read, "I would
2 take more -- it would take more than reading the
3 regulation," rather than the way it reads now and I
4 would ask that that change be made.

5 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, Mike. I
6 appreciate that. Okay, any more comments from the
7 Commissioners? Okay, I'm looking for a motion.

8 GARY SCHOFIELD: Make the motion to
9 approve the minutes. Gary Schofield for the record.

10 RONALD PIERINI: And also to add the
11 (inaudible).

12 GARY SCHOFIELD: And to add the changes
13 from Senior Deputy Attorney General Jensen.

14 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, sir. And I
15 see a second from Dan Watts. Any other discussion?
16 All in favor?

17 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

18 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. Approved. Thank
19 you. Mr. Clark, the Executive Director's Report.

20 RICHARD CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
21 Dick Clark for the record. And for brevity because
22 we've got a Law Enforcement memorial we need to get
23 through here, I'll just make a brief report. The
24 Basic Training Bureau, our academy, is going to
25 graduate 22 cadets here on the 8th and our guest

1 speaker is Director Jim Wright. And so, we will
2 proceed with that. It should be a great ceremony
3 and, supposedly, good weather.

4 There are -- this -- this academy because
5 it was shortened to 13 weeks, is, I guess, painting
6 the freight train a lot faster than we normally do.
7 They are actually in the -- doing EVOC right now and
8 trying to finish up a lot of things. We may look at
9 the next academy to lengthening slightly because of
10 scenario training. We want to broaden that
11 slightly. So we may go to -- back up to 14 weeks,
12 looking at how the 13-week program went.

13 From the Professional Development Bureau,
14 for e-learning students, we've got 6,800 training
15 hours for this year. Total training hours 7,296.
16 We've issued for Professional Certificates since the
17 last meeting, 86 Intermediates, 77 Advanced, 30
18 Supervisor, none Management or Executive and one
19 Instructor. And we have 46 e-learning courses that
20 are online right now.

21 Moving to the next item is our budget.
22 And just briefly on that, we were, you know, looking
23 at the potential of having a meeting with the
24 Governor to do a preliminary meeting with the
25 Governor to get approval or support for our very

1 much needed budget request this upcoming session.
2 And what, I guess, what's going to take place now is
3 the Sheriffs and Chiefs are going to send a letter
4 of support for the POST budget. And I think that
5 will be a better detailed review for the -- the
6 Governor's staff to review specifically what's
7 listed for items that we want the Governor's support
8 on. So that should happen here in the near future.

9 The -- I always include a quarterly
10 report. I won't go over the details of that for
11 brevity today, but you can take a look at that.
12 That's always kind of a brag as far as not only the
13 numbers that we produce, but also the quality as far
14 as on a scale of one to five, generally trying to
15 keep that up in the fours for our training and what
16 we've accomplished so far.

17 Also, if you're interested, we break down
18 certificates by agency as well so you can look at
19 even your own particular agency and see who has
20 received what particular professional certificates
21 that are listed in that program. And there's a list
22 of what -- all the courses that we've certified and
23 continue to certify those course for your officers'
24 training. I think that's pretty much my report.

25 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, Mr. Clark.

1 Any of the Commissioners have any questions? Okay.
2 We'll head onto Number 6, then, discussion, public
3 comment and for possible action. The Committee will
4 discuss and possibly take action whether to continue
5 the rulemaking process to consider repealing NAC
6 289.200(3), the regulation establishing the process
7 for a peace officer for holding Category II Basic
8 Certificate to obtain a Category I Basic Certificate
9 upon successful completion of a training course
10 approved by the Executive Director consisting of a
11 minimum of 280 hours in specific course topics.
12 Through the repeal of the regulation, the Commission
13 would no longer provide an expedited process for a
14 Category II peace officer to upgrade to a Category I
15 Certificate. So is there any -- any comments from
16 the Commission? I'm going to ask the public, then,
17 is there anybody would like to come up and -- and
18 talk about this particular issue? Seeing none,
19 anything else from the Commissioners? Any more
20 discussion? Okay, looking for a motion.

21 GARY SCHOFIELD: Make a -- Gary Schofield
22 for the record. I make a motion the Commission
23 should continue to make possible rulemaking process
24 to consider repealing NAC 289.200(3), the regulation
25 establishing an expedited process for a peace

1 officer holding a Category II Basic Certificate to
2 obtain a Category I Basic Certificate upon
3 successful completion of training course approved by
4 the Executive Director.

5 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. And do I have a
6 second?

7 DAN WATTS: Dan Watts. Second.

8 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. Any other
9 discussion? All in favor?

10 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

11 RONALD PIERINI: Anybody opposed? I nay.
12 Okay. So it carries on. Thank you very much. All
13 right, Number 7, discuss -- discussion public
14 Certification based on a gross misdemeanor
15 conviction "Conspiracy to Commit Disposal of" a
16 comment and possible action hearing of NAC
17 289.290(1)(e) revocation of Thomas R. Mendiola's,
18 formerly a Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department,
19 "Firearms to a Prohibited Person." The Commission
20 will decide whether to revoke his Category I Basic
21 Certificate. And, Mike.

22 MICHAEL JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
23 Mike Jensen for the record. This is the time and
24 place set for the hearing regarding the potential
25 revocation of Mr. Mendiola's POST certification.

1 This hearing is being held pursuant to NRS 289.510C
2 which provides for the Commission to adopt
3 regulations that establish minimum standards for
4 certification and de-certification of peace
5 officers.

6 Specifically in this case, the regulation
7 we're looking at is NAC 289.290, which establishes
8 the cause for the Commission to revoke a -- or
9 suspend a Certificate of a peace officer. The
10 subsection that we're -- we're moving forward on
11 this hearing this morning is 1H. It provides that
12 the Commission may suspend or revoke the certificate
13 of a peace officer for a gross misdemeanor
14 conviction.

15 There are a number of exhibits that are
16 behind Tab A in the book that we'll -- that I'll be
17 going through this morning and would ask that the
18 Chairman admit. They're certified copies of both
19 Commission documents as well as court documents that
20 I would ask that you admit as part of the record for
21 purposes of this hearing.

22 Start to -- looking through at Exhibit A
23 is the -- is the Third Amended Notice with Intent to
24 Revoke that was sent to Mr. Mendiola. It informs
25 him of the Commission's intent to revoke or suspend

1 his certificate. It informs him that the basis for
2 that action would be a gross misdemeanor conviction
3 for conspiracy to commit disposal of a firearm to a
4 prohibited person, which is a gross misdemeanor.

5 It's a conviction that comes out of the District
6 Court in Clark County, Nevada, and informed him of
7 the opportunity that he has to appear at this
8 hearing this morning, the time, place and location
9 of this hearing, and the opportunity to present
10 witnesses if he so chose, and also that -- to
11 present his own documents and cross-examine
12 witnesses.

13 Exhibit B is the Proof of Service. That's
14 the certified mail receipt showing that that notice
15 was signed for on March 24, 2014. Just to -- for
16 purposes of clarifying the record, you'll see on the
17 Third Amended Notice where it talks about a
18 certified mail control number, it's showing a not
19 applicable there. And so, I've asked Mr. Johnston
20 to put on the record that, in fact, this Notice of
21 Revocation was sent by certified mail and this proof
22 of service relates to that notice.

23 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Thank you, Mr. Jensen.

24 Scott Johnston for the record. That is correct.

25 This letter, Exhibit A, is the certified copy of the

1 original letter that was sent certified mail to Mr.
2 Mendiola. It was also sent to local jurisdiction
3 down there which is why the number wasn't on there
4 to -- so that they could do a personal service if we
5 -- should we have needed to use their services, and
6 we did not, being that Mr. Mendiola did receive it.
7 It was evident by Exhibit B the certified
8 certification of mail was delivered. It was mailed
9 under Certified Mail Number 9171969009350009309491
10 as signed by Mendiola.

11 MICHAEL JENSEN: Thank you. Thank you,
12 Mr. Johnston. Exhibit C is the Personnel Action
13 Report showing that Mr. Mendiola resigned from his
14 law enforcement agency effective February of 2011.
15 Exhibit D is the Basic Certificate -- Mr. Mendiola's
16 Basic Certificate.

17 The next documents are the Court documents
18 that relate to his conviction. The first is the
19 first indictment which charged Mr. Mendiola with
20 disposal of a firearm to a prohibited person,
21 indicating that the crime took place in Clark County
22 in July of 2010 -- between July of 2010 and August
23 of 2010.

24 The next document is his plea -- guilty
25 plea agreement, which shows that he agreed to plead

1 guilty to that crime of conspiracy to commit
2 disposal of a firearm to a prohibited person, a
3 gross misdemeanor in violation of NRS 199.480 and
4 NRS 202.362. The next document -- or attached to
5 that document there's an exhibit, it's the Amended
6 Indictment that Mr. Mendiola was agreeing to plead
7 guilty to. It's, essentially, the same charge
8 conspiracy to commit disposal of a firearm to a
9 prohibited person. You'll see that the next
10 document is the actual filed Amended Indictment.
11 The portion that I would -- of that document that I
12 would draw your attention to is the factual basis
13 for that crime. It indicates that on or between
14 July 10 of 2010 and August 19 of 2010, Mr. Mendiola
15 did then and there meet with an unknown co-
16 conspirator and between themselves and each of them
17 with the other willfully and unlawfully did conspire
18 and agree to commit a crime. They did then and
19 there willfully and unlawfully conspire to sell or
20 otherwise dispose of a firearm. It describes that
21 firearm being a Strum Ruger handgun to another
22 person, Robert Justice, and that Mr. Mendiola, the
23 defendant, having actual knowledge that Mr. Robert
24 Justice was under indictment for and had been
25 convicted of a felony, it provides that Mr. Justice

1 had previously been convicted of felonies of theft
2 by control and/or representation and/or controlling
3 stolen property with a value of \$3,000 or more, but
4 less than \$25,000, theft of means of transportation
5 by control and by controlling stolen property and
6 fleeing from a law enforcement vehicle, a conviction
7 that came out of Pima County, Arizona, from 2002.

8 The final document is the Judgment of
9 Conviction showing that Mr. Mendiola was convicted
10 of that particular crime that he, as part of his
11 sentence was ordered to pay a \$2,000 fine and an
12 assessment fee and a DNA fee and to forfeit any
13 interest in the weapon that was seized as part of
14 the investigation.

15 Based on the serious nature of this
16 criminal charge and what is a clear violation of
17 public's trust placed in him as a peace officer,
18 Staff believes that that action disqualifies him
19 from -- that conviction disqualifies him from being
20 a peace officer and, therefore, recommend that he --
21 his POST Certificate be revoked.

22 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, Mr. Jensen.
23 And your exhibits are approved and submitted. Any
24 questions from the Commissioners? Do we have
25 anybody in the audience that would like to make

1 comment on this particular topic? Seeing none, I'm
2 looking for a motion.

3 JAMES WRIGHT: Mr. Chairman, for the
4 record, Jim Wright. I'd like to make a motion that
5 the Commission revoke Mr. Mendiola's Category I
6 Basic Certificate based on the information that has
7 been presented to us.

8 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, Director. Do
9 I have a second?

10 DARIN BAALAM: Darin Baalam. Second.

11 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you for the second.
12 Any other discussion? All in favor?

13 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

14 RONALD PIERINI: Anybody opposed? So
15 carried.

16 GARY SCHOFIELD: I have to abstain. The
17 Metropolitan Police Department conducted this
18 investigation of Mr. Mendiola and I was in charge of
19 the Internal Affairs Unit at that time.

20 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you. Please note
21 that. We're going to go onto Number 8 discussion,
22 public comment and for possible action the POST
23 Commission to consider request from Carson City
24 Sheriff's Office for Executive Certificate for
25 Captain Jeffrey Melvin. I would think that is Mr.

1 Clark.

2 RICHARD CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
3 Dick Clark for the record. Captain Melvin has
4 completed the necessary training and education
5 necessary for the issuance of the certificate. He
6 currently fills an executive level position with
7 Carson City Sheriff's Office and that he is
8 qualified for the Executive Certificate. He has a
9 letter of request from Sheriff Furlong and POST
10 Staff recommends approval and issuance of the
11 Executive POST Certificate.

12 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you very much. Do
13 we have any questions from the Commission? And I
14 would think the Captain is here.

15 JEFFREY MELVIN: True.

16 RONALD PIERINI: Would you like to make
17 any comment?

18 JEFFREY MELVIN: No, sir.

20 the certificate here. Okay, let's look for a
21 motion.

22 GARY SCHOFIELD: Make a motion to approve

12 you'd come up, please.

13 JAMES KINGERA: Good morning, Mr.
14 Chairman, members of the Board of Commissioners. My
15 name is Jim Kingera, for the record, K-I-N-G-E-R-A.
16 I'm the Chief for Nevada Youth Parole.

17 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. And you're asking
18 for an extension, and if you could tell us what that
19 is -- what's the reason for that.

20 JAMES KINGERA: Yes, I am. Miss Feher was
21 reappointed to the Nevada Youth Parole Bureau on or
22 about June 10 of 2013. Her plan was to complete the
23 Silver State Law Enforcement Academy which would --
24 is scheduled to begin, I believe, on or about May 7
25 of this month. During her training to get ready for

1 the physical fitness exam, she has incurred a
2 hairline fracture in her ankle. So on the doctor's
3 recommendation, she would be unable to complete the
4 physical fitness part of it. With that being said,
5 I believe Silver State Law Enforcement Academy next
6 Cat II academy is scheduled for September. She will
7 be in that academy at that time. However, with that
8 being said, I believe the academy will fall about
9 three days outside of the six-month extension with
10 the graduation that's scheduled to graduate sometime
11 in December. And that's about three days outside of
12 the six month's extension. I can -- I can assure
13 this Board that she is not acting in any capacity of
14 the law enforcement or a peace officer at this time.
15 She does not have a badge, she does not, you know,
16 carry any of our equipment. She is more or less
17 handcuffed to her desk.

18 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, sir. I'm
19 going to look over to Scott Johnston, if you have
20 anything to add on that, please.

21 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Scott Johnston for the
22 record. No, just like to reiterate and confirm what
23 the Chief has already said that should the
24 Commission approve the six-month extension, that
25 would take the date out to December 10 of this year.

1 And, I believe she would be scheduled to graduate
2 from the Academy on December 13. So as the Chief
3 had indicated, that would just be a three-day lapse
4 with no powers of a peace officer until
5 certification requirements have been fulfilled.
6 Staff would have no objection to approving it at
7 this time.

8 RONALD PIERINI: Let me ask you a
9 question, Scott, just for the record. Do you have
10 the -- the doctor's excuse -- slip saying that she
11 needs to have that or do you have documentation from
12 the physician?

13 SCOTT JOHNSTON: Scott Johnston for the
14 record. No, sir, we do not have any medical
15 documentation. That may possibly be a HIPPA issue.
16 Not sure about that. We do have that indicated,
17 that -- in the Chief's letter, but we do not have
18 any medical documentation.

19 RONALD PIERINI: Okay. Thank you.

20 GARY SCHOFIELD: I have a question. Sir,
21 how is she going to finish the academy? She's got
22 an injury right now? Is that -- is that what I'm
23 hearing? Is there no physical fitness inside of the
24 academy?

25 JAMES KINGERA: There will be a physical

1 fitness test, a pre-test in September.

2 GARY SCHOFIELD: Okay.

3 JAMES KINGERA: Our plans is that she'll
4 be fine in September. Right now she's in physical
5 therapy. She attends once a -- once a week. So
6 between now and September, she should be where she
7 needs to be to complete the pre-physical fitness
8 exam, which will be the introduction for her
9 entering the academy in September.

10 GARY SCHOFIELD: Okay.

11 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you. Any other
12 questions from the Commission? How about anybody
13 else in the audience would like to make a comment?
14 Looking for a motion.

15 DARIN BAALAM: Darin Baalam for the
16 record. I make a motion that we grant the six-month
17 extension.

18 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, sir.

19 JAMES WRIGHT: Jim Wright. I second.

20 RONALD PIERINI: Thank you, Jim. Any
21 other comments from the Commission? All in favor?

3 5:00 o'clock. Something like.

4 RONALD PIERINI: Okay, thank you.

5 RICHARD CLARK: But we'll -- we'll lock in
6 on that depending on what we come up with for an
7 agenda if we need a double or a single meeting.

8 RONALD PIERINI: Okay, good. Thank you,
9 Dick. All right. We're going -- any other
10 discussion from the public on that particular topic?
11 The last one is discussion, public comment and for
12 possible action for adjournment. That's never a

Executive Order 2014-11

**PROVIDING RECIPROCITY FOR MILITARY MEMBERS AND VETERANS
SEEKING LICENSURE IN THIS STATE**

WHEREAS, Nevada was born during wartime and its citizens have served their nation courageously and proudly in uniform for 150 years since;

WHEREAS, on March 4, 1865, mere months after Nevada became a state, President Abraham Lincoln affirmed the nation's commitment to serve its veterans and their families in his second inaugural address, obligating the nation "to care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow, and his orphan;"

WHEREAS, with countless service members, veterans, and their families transitioning out of the military in the coming years, President Lincoln's words are as appropriate today as they were when he first said them;

WHEREAS, America's transitioning service members are highly trained, experienced, and credentialed and should be welcome additions to workplaces and communities throughout the state; however, they often face barriers when seeking civilian licensure equivalent to their military training and experience;

WHEREAS, my office has received a grant from the National Governors Association to address licensure reciprocity issues facing transitioning service members and veterans, especially in the fields of emergency medical services, licensed practical nurses, and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Article 5, Section 1 of the Nevada Constitution provides that, "The supreme executive power of this State, shall be vested in a Chief Magistrate who shall be Governor of the State of Nevada."

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Nevada, I hereby direct and order that the following licensure bodies overseeing emergency medical services, licensed practical nurses, and law enforcement professionals develop specific bridge and reciprocity programs, as follows:

For Licensed Practical Nurses:

1. The Nevada State Board of Nursing (NSBN) shall work with the College of Southern Nevada to develop a specific bridge training program to expedite education for service members and veterans;
2. The Nevada Department of Veterans Services (NDVS) shall provide funding support in a sum not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the development of this program, with additional funding to be determined by the Director; and
3. The NSBN shall work with my office to develop appropriate questions to add to applications for licensure to better capture the number of service members and veterans holding licenses or seeking licensure in Nevada.

For Emergency Medical Services:


1. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) shall work with emergency medical service educational programs to develop a bridge training program to expedite education for service members and veterans;
2. NDVS shall provide funding support in a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00 for the development of this program, with additional funding to be determined by the Director; and
3. HHS shall work with my office to develop appropriate questions to add to renewal and licensure applications to better capture the number of service members and veterans holding licenses or seeking licensure in Nevada.

For Law Enforcement:

1. The Nevada Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (POST) shall identify any unique challenges facing service members and veterans seeking civilian law enforcement licensure;
2. POST shall examine existing bridge programs from other states and make recommendations to develop appropriate programs in Nevada by October 15, 2014; and
3. POST shall work with my office to develop appropriate questions to add to licensure applications to better capture the number of service members and veterans holding licenses or seeking licensure in Nevada.







DISCUSSION, PUBLIC COMMENT, AND FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

The Commission will discuss, receive public comment and possibly take action to adopt, amend or repeal the Commission's regulations as set out in Legislative Counsel Bureau File No. R051-14. The Commission will consider fully all written and oral comments received on the proposed changes to the Commission's regulations.

The proposed changes to the Commission's regulations, referenced as LCB File No. RO51-14, contain the following sections:

Section 1. Amending NAC 289.260(6) which contains the requirements for a Management Certificate to remove the requirement for six *units of credit from an accredited college or university*. The Intermediate and Advanced Certificates already have higher education requirements. The removal of this wording is needed to remove a conflict with the new standards. Making this change will properly align the Management Certificate with the Intermediate and Advanced Certificates.

Section 2. Amending NAC 289.290(1)(e) and (1)(g), which identify circumstances which constitute causes for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer.

1. Change subsection (1)(e) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a gross misdemeanor.
2. Change subsection (1)(g) to include having been convicted of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to*, a felony.

Section 3. Repealing NAC 289.280 which establishes the standards for an Instruction Certificate. The Commission is repealing this regulation because an Instruction Certificate has been found to be unnecessary to improve the quality of instruction of peace officers.

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets ~~omitted-material~~ is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-3, NRS 289.510.

A REGULATION relating to peace officers; revising the requirements for the granting of a management certificate to a peace officer; revising provisions governing the suspension, refusal or revocation of a certificate as a peace officer; repealing provisions providing for the issuance and maintenance of an instruction certificate; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest

Existing law requires the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for the certification and training of peace officers. (NRS 289.510) Under existing regulations, the requirements a peace officer must satisfy to obtain a management certificate include, without limitation, a requirement that the officer obtain intermediate and advanced certificates. (NAC 289.260) An officer may obtain intermediate and advanced certificates by satisfying certain requirements, including, without limitation, the completion of a certain number units of credit at a college or university, a certain number of years of experience or certain combinations of both. (NAC 289.240 and 289.250, as amended by sections 2 and 3, respectively, of LCB File No. R188-12) **Section 1** of this regulation removes the requirement that an officer must successfully complete at least six units of college or university credit to obtain a management certificate. Thus, under **section 1**, an officer who obtained the intermediate and advanced certificates through obtaining years of experience would not be required to successfully complete college or university credits to obtain a management certificate.

Under existing regulations, a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer is convicted of a crime. (NAC 289.290) **Section 2** of this regulation provides that a certificate as a peace officer may be suspended, refused or revoked if the peace officer pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to a felony or gross misdemeanor. Thus, under **section 2**, a peace officer's certificate may be suspended, refused or revoked if he or

she: (1) is convicted of, or pleads guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to, a felony or gross misdemeanor; or (2) is convicted of a misdemeanor.

Section 3 of this regulation repeals provisions of existing regulations which establish requirements for the issuance and maintenance of instruction certificates.

Section 1. NAC 289.260 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.260 The Executive Director shall grant a management certificate to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

1. A current basic certificate.
2. A current intermediate certificate.
3. A current advanced certificate.
4. A current supervisor certificate.
5. Six years of experience as a peace officer, including at least 1 year of experience in a management level position and a current assignment in a management level position. The applicant must present proof that the current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057 by submitting a letter with the application that is signed by the administrator of the agency. The letter must include an organizational chart which demonstrates the applicant's position within the agency and must describe the manner in which the applicant's current assignment meets the criteria for a management level position as set forth in NAC 289.057.
6. ~~Six units of credit from an accredited college or university.~~

~~7.1~~ Successful completion of 200 hours of training in a management training program certified by the Commission which includes, without limitation, courses in the following subjects:

- (a) Introduction to management;
- (b) Public administration;
- (c) Financial administration;
- (d) Personnel administration;
- (e) Management and labor relations; and
- (f) Policy formulation.

Sec. 2. NAC 289.290 is hereby amended to read as follows:

289.290 1. Each of the following constitutes cause for the Commission to revoke, refuse or suspend the certificate of a peace officer:

- (a) Willful falsification of any information provided to obtain the certificate.
- (b) A permanent or chronic physical or mental disability affecting the officer's ability to perform his or her full range of duties.
- (c) Chronic drinking or drunkenness on duty.
- (d) Addiction to or the unlawful use or possession of narcotics or other drugs.
- (e) Conviction of, *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a gross misdemeanor. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed.
- (f) Failure to comply with the standards established in this chapter.

(g) Conviction of , *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere to,* a felony. Upon criminal indictment or filing of a criminal complaint, suspension may be imposed. Upon conviction ~~H~~ *or entry of a plea of guilty, guilty but mentally ill or nolo contendere,* the certificate will be revoked.

(h) Conviction of a misdemeanor. If the employing agency recommends suspension or revocation following conviction of the employee for a misdemeanor, suspension or revocation may be imposed. In determining whether to suspend or revoke the certificate, the Commission will consider the type of conviction and other information provided by the agency indicating unprofessional conduct or similar undesirable activity by the officer that resulted in disciplinary action.

2. Denial, suspension or revocation procedures will not be considered by the Commission in cases where the employment of an officer is terminated for violations of the policies, general orders or similar guidelines of operation of the employing agency which do not constitute any of the causes for denial, suspension or revocation specified in subsection 1.

3. The employing agency shall notify the Commission any time that it becomes aware that one of its officers has been charged with a crime that could result in denial, suspension or revocation procedures. Upon receipt of information alleging any of the causes enumerated in subsection 1, the Commission will determine whether to pursue revocation or suspension of the certificate of the officer.

4. The Commission will notify the officer by certified mail at the officer's last known address of any pending revocation or suspension action and of the nature of the charges and the officer's right to appear and answer the charges. The officer shall, within 15 days after the date

on the certified mail receipt, respond in writing, notifying the Commission of his or her intended action with reference to the charges.

5. If the officer fails to notify the Commission within the specified time of his or her intention to appear in answer to the pending action, the Commission will:

(a) Consider the case on its own merits, using the statement from the head of the employing agency or the substantiated information derived from any independent investigation it deems necessary;

(b) Take no action pending the outcome of possible criminal action which may be filed against the officer; and

(c) Take no action pending the outcome of an appeal.

↳ The Commission's decision will be determined by a majority vote of the members of the Commission present.

6. When an officer notifies the Commission of his or her intention to appear and answer the charges pending against him or her, the Commission will elect to sit as a whole at a hearing or designate an independent hearing officer to hear the matter and make recommendations in writing to the Commission. The Commission will review the recommendations of any such hearing officer and arrive at a decision by majority vote of the members present.

7. The Commission will notify the officer of its decision within 15 days after the hearing.

8. An applicant for a certificate who has not been previously certified, but who would be subject to revocation for any cause set out in subsection 1, will not be granted a certificate.

9. If, upon receiving a written allegation that a peace officer is in violation of any provision of subsection 1 and that the facts and circumstances indicate that suspension rather than

revocation would be in the best interests of the agency and law enforcement in general, the Commission will suspend the officer's certificate.

10. The Commission will provide each peace officer whose certificate is suspended with written notice of the suspension by certified registered mail. The suspension becomes effective 24 hours after receipt of the certified notice. The notice will contain a statement advising the officer of the right to a hearing.

11. Suspension of a certificate is not a bar to future revocation of the certificate and any prior suspensions may be considered as a factor if revocation is being considered by the Commission.

12. Five years after the revocation of a certificate, an officer may submit a written request to the Commission to allow him or her to reinstate his or her certificate. The Commission will schedule a hearing to consider whether to reinstate the officer's certificate. The Commission will notify the agency that requested the revocation of the date and time of the hearing. After the hearing, the Commission will determine whether to reinstate the certificate. If the certificate is reinstated, the Commission may establish a probationary period during which any misconduct by the officer would result in revocation.

Sec. 3. NAC 289.280 is hereby repealed.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

289.280 Instruction certificate. (NRS 289.510)

1. The Executive Director shall grant an instruction certificate in a specific subject to an officer upon submission of proof satisfactory to the Executive Director that the officer meets the following minimum requirements:

(a) Two years of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued or 2 years of education and 1 year of experience in the subject for which the certificate is issued.

(b) Successful completion of a formal course of instruction in the:

(1) Subject for which the certificate is issued; and

(2) Development of instructors.

(c) Development and submission for approval by the Executive Director of a detailed lesson plan for the subject for which the certificate is issued, including, without limitation, objectives for the performance of the students that can be measured with a written or practical examination.

(d) Submission to the Executive Director of a current written résumé covering the areas of:

(1) Personal identification;

(2) Educational experience;

(3) Work experience;

(4) Teaching experience; and

(5) Recommendation of the employing agency.

↳ Instructors may also be certified on the basis of extraordinary experience, education or expertise in an unusually technical subject area.

2. To maintain an instructor certificate, an instructor must teach at least one class in the subject for which the certificate is issued during the year immediately preceding each anniversary date of the issuance of the certificate. An instructor must provide evidence of compliance with this requirement upon the request of the Executive Director.

Details:

On August 21, 2013, Nevada Department of Public Safety, Investigation Division (NVDPS-ID) Detective (Det.) William Dawson interviewed David Lee KARRER, the suspect in this investigation. The following is a synopsis of the interview, for further details refer to the digital recording of the interview.

Mr. KARRER was asked to relate his memory of the events of the previous evening, in which a firearm was discharged into a television in his bedroom and the subsequent evacuation of his children from the residence. Mr. KARRER told Detective Dawson that he was involved in a divorce which has become quite confrontational and ugly. As a byproduct of this, he has begun having nightmares at night, regarding the safety of his children and their custody, especially after confrontations with his ex-wife or her family.

Mr. KARRER went on to relate to Det. Dawson that he had no memory of the incident itself. He described to Det. Dawson that he was asleep, having gone to bed some time around 9:00 p.m. the previous evening. He awoke at some point in the night and discovered his television on, but there was no picture, only noise coming from the speakers. He also observed a light on in the kitchen of the residence, but no other lights on.

Mr. KARRER related that he observed his Glock nine (9) millimeter caliber pistol on his bed and a large hole in the glass front of his television. Seeing this, he began looking for his children, whom he could not find; as well as looking for his cellular phone, which he also could not find. Upon discovering that his children and his phone were missing, Mr. KARRER dressed and walked to the home of his girlfriend, Ms. Jen TOLAND, approximately a five minute walk away. When asked why he walked and had not driven, Mr. KARRER said he had been drinking and did not want to drive. When asked why he did not call Ms. TOLAND, Mr. KARRER related that he did not have a house phone, only a cell phone, and it was gone.

After waking Ms. TOLAND, they drove into Winnemucca, and found a pay phone, where he called his ex-wife, Ms. Jerry KARRER, but his sister in-law Ms. Adrienne OPENLANDER answered the phone. Mr. KARRER spoke with Ms. OPENLANDER who told him he needed to talk to the Sheriff. Mr. KARRER related that this pay phone was located at the "Maverick II" and said it was the only phone that worked, out of all the other phones they tried at various gas stations along the "Boulevard." (Mr. KARRER explained that he chose to use a pay phone, because he did not want the drama which would be added to the situation, by calling his ex-wife's phone, with his current girlfriend's cell phone.) Once this was done, he had Ms. TOLAND drive him to the home of Sheriff KILGORE, whom he spoke with at length regarding the incident.

Mr. KARRER was asked if he takes any medication to which he said

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He did admit to drinking three glasses of Jack Daniels Whiskey, mixed with Caffeine Free Diet Pepsi, from late in the afternoon, to around nine (9:00 p.m.) that evening, at which point he went to sleep. Detective Dawson asked if Mr. KARRER mixed his drinks strong, to which he responded that he did not like the taste of Jack Daniels, therefore when he makes his drinks, he does not mix them very strong. When asked about eating that afternoon or evening prior to the incident, Mr. KARRER said he had some nachos that afternoon, and the children had eaten some pizza rolls around six (6:00 p.m.) in the evening.

When asked if he had been subject to any internal investigations, as a part of his job duties for the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, Mr. KARRER said no. He related that he has always had good reviews and there has never been a complaint filed against him.

On August 21, 2013, Nevada Department of Public Safety, Investigation Division, Detective (Det.) William Dawson interviewed _____ daughter of David Karrer, regarding this investigation. The following is a synopsis of this interview, for further details refer to the digital recording of the interview.

When asked, _____ told Det. Dawson that she heard a loud "boom," after that, she started calling for her dad, David KARRER, who wouldn't answer, even though she was "screaming really loud." She went to check on him in his bedroom and observed his television was not on, but she heard sound coming out of the television and saw a hole in the front of it. Then she saw her dad, with a gun in his hand, and his eyes were closed, seeing this, _____ said she went and told her brother, _____, what she had seen, but he did not believe her. With this, she went back into her dad's room and retrieved his phone which had been on the floor, then called her mother, Jerry KARRER.

_____ said her mother told her she was going to call the Police and told _____ to hold on and "be small." After the call to her mother, she received a call from her Aunt, Adrienne OPENLANDER, who was working in the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center. Adrienne told her to get her brother and leave the house. _____ did as she was instructed, taking her brother, who was only wearing his underwear and shoes, out of the house and through the darkness to a point on the road where they were picked up.

When asked if she had spoken with anyone about these events, _____ related that she had only spoken of these matters to her family members, i.e., her mother (Jerry Karrer), Adrienne (the aunt), and her grandparents. When asked about dinner the evening before the incident, she related that her and Wyatt ate a light dinner after his practice, but did not remember what her dad had eaten that evening. _____ told Det. Dawson that she and her brother ate some pizza rolls and chips, because they had a late lunch, earlier in the day.

When asked what time they went to sleep, _____ told Det. Dawson that they normally go to sleep around nine o'clock in the evening, which is what time she believed they went to bed. When asked if her dad went to bed at the same time as they did, _____ said he normally goes to bed around nine-thirty (9:30) at night, usually watching television for a few moments after she and her brother go to bed.

NOLO CONTENDERE PLEA AGREEMENT

I hereby agree to plead nolo contendere to: UNLAWFUL DISCHARGE OF A WEAPON, A Gross Misdemeanor, in violation of NRS 202.290.

My decision to plead nolo contendere is based upon the plea agreement in this case which is as follows:

Both sides are free to argue at the time of sentencing. The State agrees not to pursue any further charges originating from the incident. The State will not oppose Defendant applying for a Chapter 458 Diversion Program. If Defendant is not admitted to 458 Diversion then Defendant can move the Court to

1 withdraw his nolo contendere plea and the State will not oppose
2 said motion and the matter could be remanded back to Justice
3 Court.

4 The State explicitly reserves the right to present facts
5 and/or argument through witnesses and/or victims at time of
6 sentencing. Furthermore, the State retains the right to comment
7 on Defendant's crimes, past conduct and/or present evidence in
8 any form.

9
10 I understand that if the State of Nevada has agreed to
11 recommend or stipulate to a particular sentence or has agreed
12 not to present argument regarding the sentence, or agreed not to
13 oppose a particular sentence, such agreement is contingent upon
14 my appearance in Court on the initial sentencing date (and any
15 subsequent date if the sentencing is continued). I understand
16 that if I fail to appear for any future scheduled court date in
17 regards to this case or I commit a new criminal offense prior to
18 sentencing, the State of Nevada is released from any agreement
19 as to sentence and would regain the full right to argue for any
20 lawful sentence.

22 I have entered into these negotiations and have signed this
23 document of my own free will without threat or promise on the
24 part of anyone other than expressed herein.

26 **CONSEQUENCES OF THE PLEA**

27 I understand that by pleading nolo contendere I admit the

16 DNA assessment fee of \$3, ~~and a DNA fee in the amount of \$150.~~ ^{R.W.}
17 Furthermore, I understand that pursuant to NRS 176A.100 if I was
18 on probation at the time I committed this offense, probation is
19 not mandatory for any Category E offense to which I plead nolo
20 contendere. I understand that, if appropriate, I will be ordered
21 to make restitution to the victim of the offenses to which I am
22 pleading nolo contendere and to the victim of any related
23 offense which is being dismissed or not prosecuted pursuant to
24 this agreement. I will also be ordered to reimburse the State
25 of Nevada for expenses related to my extradition, if any.
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I understand that I am eligible for probation for the offense to which I am pleading nolo contendere. I understand that, except as otherwise provided by statute, the question of whether I receive probation is in the discretion of the sentencing judge.

I understand that there is a collateral consequence of deportation if I am not a citizen of the United States of America, I have been advised that conviction of the offense for which I have been charged may have the consequences of deportation, exclusion from admission to the United States of America, or denial of naturalization pursuant to the laws of the United States of America.

I understand that the District Attorney's Office shall not be bound by any oral negotiations preceding the actual execution of this Agreement until such time as this Agreement has been actually executed, that is, signed, by the District Attorney or one of his authorized deputies and I have entered my plea before the court.

1 Any misrepresentation of my prior criminal record will
2 allow the State to withdraw from this plea agreement.

7 I understand that information regarding charges not filed,
8 dismissed charges or charges to be dismissed pursuant to this
