RE: Training Opportunity for Rural Law Enforcement Chiefs, Sheriffs, and Senior Level Managers in Second-in-Command Positions

The Harrisville Police Department and the Criminal Justice Institute's National Center for Rural Law Enforcement (NCRLE) are co-hosting the Rural Executive Management Institute (REMI) training for rural law enforcement executives. The training will be held in Salt Lake City, Utah on April 27 – May 1, 2014.

This four-day REMI training provides management education and training that is specific to rural law enforcement executives. The program is designed to assist participants in enhancing their present leadership skills while also learning methods of more effectively and efficiently accomplishing the goals of their agencies. There is no registration cost to attend. In an effort to make this training more affordable to rural law enforcement, some expenses the participant may incur, i.e., hotel, per diem, will be covered by a federal grant through the US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance.
