MISSING CHILDREN'S INVESTIGATIONS AND THE ROLE OF AMBER ALERTS IN RECOVERING ABDUCTED CHILDREN

MAY 6 AND 7, 2014 RENO NEVADA

The Office of the Attorney General and the Nevada State Children's Advocate, along with the Washoe County Sheriff's Office and the Nevada Broadcaster's Association, is sponsoring a 12 hour, 1 ½ day training conference on missing children's investigations and AMBER Alerts on May 6 and 7, 2014, at the Regional Public Safety Training Center in Reno.

This course has been approved for 12 POST credits by Nevada POST.



This state of the art program will feature training on many aspects of these vital investigations, including modules on national resources available for missing children's investigations, national guidelines for missing children's investigations, the family perspective, investigative protocols for family abductions, the role of family courts in the investigational effort, the role of AMBER Alerts in locating and recovering abducted children, the specific criteria for the issuance of AMBER Alerts, and a Fourth Amendment refresher. Many other topics will be covered as well. The training faculty will include trainers with regionally and nationally-recognized expertise within their fields.

The course will be offered free of charge to Nevada law enforcement agencies in an effort to encourage participation by a broad range of agencies.
