Nevada Post Leadership Institute

Nevada POST is presenting the 2024 POST Leadership Institute. This program is a principlebased leadership program designed for first-line law enforcement supervisors with the intent of developing and preparing them to transition to the mid-management rank. The program is designed to stimulate personal and professional growth. Attendees will explore leadership from the perspectives of virtue, principle, values and using critical thinking to lead with a proactive ethical mindset. The program is also designed to provide additional pathways to achieving the POST Management Certificate. Successful completion of this program can be used as credit hours toward the award of the Management Certificate. The program will be held at POST in Carson City, NV and will involve 80 hours of in-person attendance in 2 and 3-day sessions over a total of four months. Attendees will explore concepts such as integrity, influence, ownership, power, loyalty and tolerance. Attendees will also learn about leadership models and examples while considering current interior and exterior forces affecting law enforcement in the State of Nevada and nationwide. The sessions will be held between August and November of 2024 (see dates below) and POST is currently accepting applications. Space is limited so interested and qualified applicants are encouraged to apply now.

Minimum Requirements For Attendance:

*Nevada Peace Officer with a minimum of 2 years of experience at the rank of <u>Sgt. or higher</u> at the time of application

*Successful Completion of the POST First Line Supervisor Course

*Able to attend all scheduled sessions of the program

*Agency must approve and sign off on application and attendance requirements.

August 21 & 22, 2024 September 24-26, 2024 October 23 & 24, 2024 November 19-21, 2024

Attendance Requirements:

*Applicant must volunteer or request to attend

*Agrees to remain employed in law enforcement for three years after completion. *Currently serves as a full-time, first-level supervisory peace officer (generally the position of Sergeant) or higher

*Has completed two years of full-time experience supervising peace officer employees *Has completed the POST First Line Supervisor Course prior to attending

The PLIP consists of 4 separate sessions held approximately every four weeks in 2 & 3-day blocks for a total of 80 in-class hours. Students are expected to attend all sessions and absences are only granted/excused under extreme circumstances. Evening social activities are strongly encouraged. A considerable amount of reading and writing is required between sessions on the student's own time. There are 3 course books required to be purchased at the agency/student expense. Students must be prepared to discuss the readings and take part in all learning activities as well as actively participate in classroom discussions. A final team project is completed in session four.

Regulation Changes

We have added several newly Adopted Regulations to the list on the POST website, <u>https://post.nv.gov/Regulations/Regulations/</u>. These new regulations are:

R004-23 amends NAC 289.110 to accommodate law changes regarding marijuana

R005-23 amends NAC289.300(1)(b) "A person enrolling in the course (basic academy) may be required to pass a physical fitness examination not sooner than 30 days before the commencement of the course and not later than 14 days after the commencement of the course..."

R006-23 amends NAC 289.200(4)(a) "Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5 or 6, an officer must pass the state physical fitness examination: (a) If the officer is not eligible for certification pursuant to subsection 2 or for the return of his/her certification to active status pursuant to subsection 9, during the officer's basic training course...."

R007-23 amends NAC 289.200(8) to remove the "full-time" requirement to maintain the basic certificate.

Training Portal

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Online PPRT Administrator and Proctor Courses

Just a reminder, the POST PPRT is a validated physical readiness test. It is not designed to measure fitness level, but rather the physical ability to complete those critical tasks that may occur within each category of peace officer. Obviously, the title can be confusing, but this is an important distinction.

<u>To reduce confusion, we will be using the term PPRT (POST Physical Readiness Test) go-</u> ing forward.

Only those administering the test for official record certification purposes are required to be PPRT Administrator certified. Those who are conducting PPRT's for hiring/recruiting purposes, or in a capacity other than the officer's record certification PPRT, are not required to be PPRT Administrator certified.

PPRT Proctor Course

POST has prepared an informational online PPRT course specifically for attendees that only conduct non-record PPRT's. Those who attend this course will receive a Certificate of Completion. But will NOT receive a PPRT Administrator's certification number. This course is located on our NV POST Training Portal. You can access the training portal at the POST website, the tab is located on the top tool bar.

PPRT Administrators Course

POST has updated the process to become a PPRT Administrator. The new process is a 2-part

process containing online training and on-site training.

Those needing to be PPRT Administrator certified for the purposes of conducting PPRT's for record purposes will take the PPRT Administrator Course on the NV POST Training Portal, located on the POST website.

Once the course has been completed, the student will work with POST to attend and observe a

PPRT. After the completion of the PPRT, the students will then complete the PPRT Administrators exam. Upon the completion of the online training, on-site training, and the passing of the exam, the student will then be emailed their PPRT Administrators Certificate of Completion with their unique PPRT Administrator number.

To enroll in this course, students will need to work with their supervisor, manager or administrator

of their agency and fill out the PPRT Administrator Course Nomination Sheet available on the

forms page of our website at post.nv.gov/forms/ and submit the completed form to Mike Hayhurst
