The next Public Hearing, Workshop and Commission meeting will be held July 14, 2026, starting at 10:00 a.m. at the POST Administration Building in Carson City. Notices will be posted to the POST website as they become available.

News from the Academy

The start of Academy 26-02 is right around the corner! The Academy begins on **Tuesday, July 14, 2026. Cadets should arrive at the Academy/ Stewart Facility, 5587 Wa Pai Shone Ave, Carson City, no later than 9:45 AM. Training will begin promptly at 10:00 AM.**

Day 1 will begin with the administration of the POST Physical Readiness Test (PPRT). Cadets should arrive both mentally and physically prepared. Summer temperatures can be extremely hot, and Cadets should be ready for outdoor physical training in warm weather conditions which includes being properly hydrated. Cadets should bring water and/or electrolyte drinks with them on Day 1.

As a reminder, under the new Academy format, training will begin on Tuesday and continue through Friday during the first 40-hour week. Cadets will be required to reside in the dormitory from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM throughout the first weekend.

We are also introducing a new event for this Academy: **Family Orientation Day**. The orientation will take place on **Friday, July 17, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.** This will provide family members with an opportunity to learn more about the academy experience and how best to support their cadet throughout the Academy.

We strongly encourage Cadets to purchase groceries, healthy snacks, hydration products, and any approved supplements before the Academy begins so they can have these items readily available in their rooms.

Academy 26-02 is expected to be one of our larger classes, and the Academy staff is looking forward to another outstanding eighteen weeks with this new group of Cadets.

We look forward to welcoming everyone on July 14th.

ACADIS SYSTEM UPDATE

Our new system will be live July 8, 2026. Starting on the 8th, point of contacts will be able to submit forms, apply for certificates, print copies of certificates, review officer records and many other features. The SPOC/Admin training guide is almost done and that will be emailed and posted on the website once it has been completed. At this time you will be able to view your employees and their records. Reporting of Investigations Pursuant to NRS 289.585

Pursuant to NRS 289.585, a law enforcement agency shall:

1. Immediately notify the Commission if a peace officer employed by the
agency
 - (a) is charged with a crime for which the regulations adopted by the
Commission authorize the Commission to revoke or suspend the cer-
tificate of the peace officer; or
 - (b) Resigns from employment or otherwise separates from employ-
ment with the agency while an investigation concerning alleged mis-
conduct is pending; and
2. If a peace officer resigns or otherwise separates from employment while
an investigation concerning alleged misconduct is pending, provide to the
Commission a written summary of the outcome of the investigation as soon
as practicable after completing the investigation.

**Agencies are ONLY required to report pursuant to the requirement
above.**

In order to assist agencies with compliance with this new statute, POST has
created a form that the employing agency can fill out and submit to Chief

RECIPROCTY PROCESS CHANGES

Effective immediately, individuals cannot enroll in the Reciprocity Course unless they are hired by an agency. Once hired, the employing agency will enroll the individual. It is recommended verification be completed by enrollment to ensure eligibility.

As a reminder: Certificate of completions are valid for 2 years from the date they completed the course. These certificates will continue to be accepted from individuals that have previously completed the course. NATIONAL DECERTIFICATION INDEX (NDI)

An additional resource for all agencies to utilize during the background process is the National Decertification Index (NDI). IADLEST created this index as a national database for revoked or suspended peace officers.

A recent change to POST statutes includes NRS 289.555(2) which states “a person is not qualified to serve as a category I, II or III peace officer, regardless of whether the person has had his or her civil rights restored, if the person has been: (2) Reported to the National Decertification Index of the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training or an equivalent database maintained for the purpose of serving as a national registry of certificate or license revocation actions relating to peace officer misconduct.” Therefore, as part of the background process, BEFORE an individual is hired, the agency should be checking NDI to confirm their candidate has not been entered by Nevada, or any other state. **If any individual has been reported to NDI by any state, for any reason, they are not eligible for hiring in Nevada.** NV POST is required, by statute, to enter all revoked peace officers into NDI, as are several other states in the country. If your agency does not have anyone with access to this system, please go to the IADLEST website: <https://www.iadlest.org/>, click in the NDI box and request access to the NDI. If your agency has enrolled in NDI, but you would like an updated list of contacts with access to the system, please contact Chief Kathy Floyd at kfloyd@post.state.nv.us. It is recommended your list of contacts be reviewed annually, and a list of contacts that need to be deleted can be sent to Chief Floyd.
